EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Sports infrastructure plays a crucial role in achieving excellence in the global arena of sports. It not only helps in producing sportspersons of international repute, but also encourages the youth population of a country to participate in sporting activities to create a culture of sports. In India, the standard of sports infrastructure is not at a satisfactory level for a number of reasons. The lack of infrastructural facilities is one of the major impediments in the process of development of sports in India. It is tough to expect medals from sportsperson without arranging for proper infrastructure facilities in sports. Sports can be a powerful tool to promote child and youth development. By providing opportunities for young people to develop transferable life skills -characteristics such as leadership, perseverance, social and moral character, self-esteem, commitment to teamwork, problem solving, and organizational ability - sports helps participants realize their potential as productive employees and citizens.

Research proves that physical education and sports play an important role in school life increasing school enrolment, retention and access to education and fostering academic achievement. Sport also offers an important avenue for creating youth employment opportunities. Sports are vital to the holistic development of young people, fostering their physical, social and emotional health. The benefits of sports reach beyond the impact on physical well-being and the value of the educational benefits of sports should not be under-estimated. Physical education and sports also build health activity habits that encourage life-long participation in physical activity. This extends the impact of physical education beyond the schoolyard and highlights the potential impact of physical education on public health. Sport inherently provides positive educational outcomes. Positive Outcomes: Physical development, Physiological and emotional development, Social development, Intellectual development.

The Department of Sports and Youth Affairs, Government of Meghalaya has introduced number of schemes to promote sports at the grass-root level. Despite all these successes, it is pertinent to mention that the sports infrastructure in the state is still not at the desired level, and this creates an obstacle in developing sports in the country. Most of the infrastructure facilities are limited to urban areas, while there needs to be concentration on developing infrastructure in rural areas also. There has been decline in the funds allocated for developing infrastructure for sports. There needs to be a unique approach towards development of sports infrastructure. PPP model initiative can be adopted in promoting state-specific infrastructure for sports.

The below mentioned conclusions and recommendations are based on the study feedbacks obtained through field level interviews conducted with the beneficiaries, officials and other opinion leaders.

Major findings of the study

- ❖ The Department of Sports and Youth Affairs have been facilitating the development of sports and games in a satisfactory manner. As per the requirement they have tried to create the necessary infrastructure required for proper grooming, nurturing and channelizing the youth potentials in the state. Apart from these various other programmes for youth development like Youth Festival, National Integration camps, De-addiction Camps etc. are being organized at frequent intervals by the department.
- ❖ More focus is given to Football ground, playgrounds and Indoor Stadiums. While the least preference is given to the construction of Badminton Court, Gymnasium, Squash Court and Swimming Pools. Most of the Indoor and Outdoor Stadiums are located in the urban areas, while playgrounds and football grounds are located in both urban and rural areas.
- ❖ The maximum numbers of sports infrastructure are built in East Khasi Hills District, while the least number of Infrastructures are built in South Garo Hills district. There is no proper maintenance and repairing work being done in most of the stadiums. There is also a shortage of coaches in few of the stadiums.
- ❖ Most of the sports personnel were of the opinion that there needs to be substantial increase in the reward money/scholarship they are getting.
- ❖ Every year, financial assistance is being given to club and associations under different schemes such as: Youth Welfare Programme, Rural Sports, Adventure Programme, Development of Sports and Games, Playground etc. During the last three years there has been increase in the number of assistance given to the Clubs/Association under different schemes. While there has been no increase in the financial aspect. Today in the present scenario where there is rapid inflation, it's very difficult for the Clubs/Associations to cater to their sports needs in a substantial manner.
- ❖ A total amount of **Rs. 94,27,69,000.00** was spent on this project for the construction of indoor/outdoor stadium and playground in the state of Meghalaya during **2003-04 to 2012-13**. From the data that is available the total earnings from these constructions can be divided in three categories Hiring charges of the playground- Rs. 1,57,13,436.00, Entry fee- Rs. 1,73,780.00, Car Pass- Rs. 1,02,200.00. The total amount of earnings being **Rs. 1,59,89,416.00**. The earnings are not enough even for the maintenance of these sports grounds let alone anything over and above the expenditure that was made
- ❖ In almost all the districts there is shortage of training personnel. The department also needs to focus on the maintenance and renovation of these facilities at regular intervals.
- ❖ About three fourth of the respondents belonged to the age group 16-40 years, which is usually considered as the most knowledgeable group. While only 9.3% of the respondents were above 50 years and 19.2% of the respondents in between 41-50 years.

- ❖ Around 90% of the respondents were satisfied with the quality of works, while 10% of the respondents were either somewhat dissatisfied or highly dissatisfied with the quality of construction work of indoor/outdoor stadiums and playgrounds.
- ❖ More than 66% of the respondents from East Khasi hills were aware of most of the sporting events organized in their district, while only 39% of the respondents from South Garo Hills were fully aware of sporting events organized in their district. While more than 40% of the respondents from the remaining districts were aware of sporting events organized in their district.
- ❖ As far as availability sports infrastructure is concerned, more than 40% of the respondents are satisfied with the availability of playground, while only 10% of the respondents are satisfied with the availability of stadiums. Most of the respondents are highly dissatisfied with the shortage of coaches and honorarium allotted for sportspersons.
- ❖ Most of the respondents have pointed out the reasons behind lack of effective implementation are inadequate funds, inadequate infrastructure, corruption in disbursing funds and inadequate communication.
- ❖ More than 60% of the respondents are satisfied with the availability of sports material in stadiums, while around 36% of the respondents are not satisfied with the availability of sports material in the stadiums.
- ❖ A large proportion of the sportspersons (35%, 22% and 17%) were attached to Football, Athletic and Volleyball respectively. As very few were associated with other disciplines. Few of the respondents stated the reason behind less attachment towards the other sports discipline is because these disciplines require more equipment and training.
- ❖ The respondents across all categories mentioned that there is a severe dearth of financial resources for the nurturing and promoting the rural talents. This is because; most of the districts have focused on infrastructure rather than on nurturing of the sports persons.
- ❖ School playgrounds in the project area put positive impact on children's learning and development, in particular, school readiness of pre-school children, increase attendance rate of primary school, decreasing drop out, friendly environment, etc.
- ❖ Improvement in the physical and mental health of children has occurred as a result of play facilities in the school premises.

Suggestions and Recommendations

- Conduct of concurrent monitoring at the grass root level by independent monitoring agencies to verify the short comes of infrastructure facilities at the grass root level. Government should plans to take up the exercise of geo-tagging for all projects on a mission mode. The space technology is being used at the grassroots level for not just “visualisation of the assets” but also for

mapping terrains to undertake other developmental works. The use of this technology will be helped streamline the implementation of schemes, monitor them efficiently, and draw up plans for the future. “Geo-tagging also enables us to develop a future course. Essentially, it gave us a sense of what we are doing and what we need to do differently.

- The Indian Olympic Association should hold national Games once in every two years i.e., six months before the Olympics and six months before the Asian Games. The minimum facilities for the various sports and games should be provided at the village, the taluka, the district, state and national levels. These should include laying tracks for athletics and play fields for basketball, football, kho-kho, kabaddi, wrestling or many other games popularly in the area at the village and taluka levels. More facilities with large size stadia must be set up both at the State and national levels.
- This should be the responsibility of the States' Sports Council, the District Sports Offices and the Schools' Games Federations. At the national level, NIS Patiala, should work in collaboration with the National Sports Federations in coordinating and developing this programme. District and State Sports Councils should undertake functions like organising sports festivals at all levels starting with villages, districts and the State level. The All India Council of Sports should be vested with more powers to make its role much more effective as a coordinating and supervising body for the promotion of sports in the country.
- Mass media, like AIR/TV must be effectively involved in promoting sports and health consciousness and inculcating the habit of physical exercises as a way of life. They must also consider devoting more time to games and sports. TV and AIR may develop a policy for popularisation of games and sports. The Films Division can help in these programmes by developing films libraries and in promoting the distribution of films on physical education, sports and games.
- There needs to be priority given for construction of mini Indoor/Outdoor stadiums at block /village levels and maintenance of the existing infrastructure needs to be improved. Attention must be paid to construct playground with necessary sports kits to attract hidden talents to think sports as a profession.
- The vision is to develop the facility as an integrated indoor/ outdoor sports precinct of regional standard and to maximize use and sharing of facilities by providing function spaces, meeting and board rooms with central kitchens that can be shared by all users as well as available for public hire. This theme can also be extended to provide central administration area, food and beverage and catering facilities.
- The department needs to focus priority on finance and human resources, to provide back up support especially with respect to coaching and training. Training programme for coaches needs to be conducted at frequent intervals due importance needs to be given to talented sportsperson.

- Awareness needs to be created at all levels through organizing study class, seminar, screening short films related to sports, exhibitions, coaching camps, mass run etc.
- The formation of large number of Sports Club should be encouraged. These will serve urban youth. Regular competitions should be arranged between such clubs within the same city and between the clubs in the various cities.
- National Physical Fitness Programme must be re-oriented and implemented more meaningfully all over the state as a continuous programme. Audio-visual publicity and propagation through mass media would help in not only follow up and feedback but in its further population.
- Sports Festivals should be held at District headquarters once a year and in the State capitals at regular intervals. These will help promote sports consciousness.
- Emphasis should be given to indigenous, traditional and rural sports like kho-kho, kabaddi, wrestling and the like. Yogic exercises should also be propagated and widely practiced and included in the school syllabus as part of physical education.
- Associations and sports clubs needs to be given priority to organize sporting events at grass root level and Identification of talents should be on specific sports disciplines with local interest and natural abilities of the sportsperson.
- Introduction of various commercial aspects, such as hospitality packages, branding inside the stadiums etc. for making the infrastructure facilities sustainable.
- Encouragement of different ways to use sport for communication and social mobilization, particularly at the national, regional and local levels, engaging civil society through active participation.
- Working with the voluntary sector (including clubs) to increase its capacity and skills, to develop sustainable solutions for community ownership and operation of sports facilities. Making sport a better business proposition by continuing to drive excellence and equality in sports structures and provision.
- Excellent sports person needs to be honoured with service, scholarship and other facilities and Helping local authorities make positive decisions about their sports provision.
- Encouragement of different ways to use sport for communication and social mobilization, particularly at the national, regional and local levels, engaging civil society through active participation.
- Create iconic facilities for community sport and a new generation of volunteer 'sport makers' inspired by the Games.
- Priorities seeks to prepare the annual calendar well in advance for providing required support to the sports persons for participation in major events.
- Setting up of a State Sports Development Fund for mobilizing resources from other sources other than government.

- The National Sports Festival of Women which should be preceded by State level and District level festivals for women to be arranged by the State Sports Council and the District Sports Offices respectively, should continue to be held regularly and should include more and more games and sports.
- Disciplines which are more popular and in which the tribal belts have a long-standing tradition like football, track and field events etc. may be assigned to tribal areas. Special programmes for these areas should be planned by the concerned States' Sports Councils.
- The various agencies should devote more resources primarily on games and sports at which India has a reasonably good chance of doing well with emphasis on football and athletics. Adequate training must be imparted at the various coaching institutes and camps much in advance of the competitions.

Chapter-1

Background of the Study

1.1 Introduction

The importance of participation in sports and physical education activities for good health, a high degree of physical fitness, increase in individual productivity and also its value as a means of beneficial recreation, promoting social harmony and discipline is well established. The need of every citizen, irrespective of age and sex, to participate in and enjoy games, sports, and recreational activities is, therefore, hereby recognized. The necessity of raising the national standards in games and sports, our sportsmen and women acquaint themselves. Creditably in international sports competitions is equally recognised. It is the duty of the Central and State Governments, therefore, to accord to sports and physical education a very high priority in the process of all-round development. They would promote and develop traditional and modern games and sports, and also yoga, by providing the necessary facilities and infrastructure on a large scale and by inculcating sports consciousness among the masses, so that by their regular participation in sports and physical education activities, the nation is made healthy fit and strong.

The rural population of India, comprising about 70 percent of the country's total population with a higher level of physical fitness, physiological and morphological status with respect to the others, seems to be a pillar of strength in the Country's sports arena. To tap hidden talents for participation in sports events at the national and international levels requires adequate attention and nourishment on the part of the government. Towards the endeavor, the government has undertaken several attempts by introducing several schemes to tap the hidden talents. Despite the fact, the Country has not yet succeeded in achieving the desired result.

It is observed that sports and games remain the monopoly of the urban population, where better awareness, sports equipment, training, infrastructure, and other facilities are available. Rural Sports Programme was launched by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India in the year 1970-71 with a view to broad-base games and sports and to tap the hidden talents in the rural areas.

It is recognised that the rural population of India, comprising about 70 percent of the country's total population with a higher level of physical fitness, physiological and morphological status with respect to the others, can be a pillar of strength in the country's sports arena.

1.2 About Sports Policy

The history of sports in India dates back to the Vedic era. There is a fascinating link between Greece and India, which stretches back to 975 B.C. It is more than likely that many of today's Olympic disciplines are sophisticated versions of the games of strength and speed that flourished in ancient India and Greece. Chess, wrestling, polo, archery and hockey (possibly a fall-out from polo) are some of the games that have originated in India. Festivals and local fairs are the natural venues of indigenous games and martial arts. In the post-independence era, the government has made special efforts to preserve and nurture the awesome cultural heritage, by setting up a number of new incentives, and by heightening media exposure at the national level, to propagate and popularize indigenous games.

Over the years, the Government of India has launched several programmes to encourage sports in the country. However, we are yet to achieve a place of pride in international sports. We are lagging much behind even among the Asian countries. This indicates that the implementation of sports programmes in the country leaves for much space for progress. Recognising the importance of sports, prior to the commencement of the 9th Asian Games, a separate department was set up in 1982. Subsequently, the first National Sports Policy was announced in 1984. The Ministry of Human Resource Development was set up in 1985, with the objective of integrating efforts for the development of human potential in the areas of Education, Women & Child Development, Arts and culture, Youth Affairs & Sports through its constituent departments. The Sports Authority of India (SAI) was established in 1984 as a registered society in pursuance of a Government of India resolution. Its main objectives include the effective and optimal utilisation of various sports facilities and all matters pertaining to sports promotion and sports management.

The salient features of the new National Sports Policy 2001 are given below:

- ❖ Broad-basing of sports and achievement of excellence
- ❖ Up-gradation and development of infrastructure
- ❖ Support to the National Sports Federations and other appropriate bodies
- ❖ Strengthening of scientific coaching and training support to the sports discipline
- ❖ An Incentive to sportspersons in the form of cash or kinds
- ❖ Enhanced participation of women, tribal and rural youth
- ❖ Involvement of the corporate sector in sports promotion and
- ❖ Creation of greater awareness to promote sports into the grassroots level too.

In the National Sports Policy, 2001, high priority is accorded to the development of sports in the rural areas to harness the available unknown talents and potential. In this context, the Village Panchayats/Gram Sabhas, as well as rural youth and sports clubs, will be mobilised to facilitate development of the requisite infrastructure and for the identification of talent through an appropriate competition structure in the rural areas as also in the disadvantaged and remote parts of the country

which appear to merit special consideration under various schemes including for the North East. There has been a strong tradition of indigenous and traditional games in practically all parts of the country through ages. Indigenous games are being promoted through schemes related to rural sports & Northeast Sports Festival.

1.3 North East Sports

The North-east Sports Festival (NSF) scheme was launched in the year 1986-87 to broad-base games and sports in the North-eastern states and to tap the hidden talents in the area. The states covered under the scheme are Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura. Under the component, North East sports festival is organised involving sportspersons from the North-East states every year. The sports disciplines which are very popular in the region are included in the festival.

Under the NEC scheme financial assistance are given to the States and to the registered Sports Clubs/NGO's within this region for improvement of playgrounds, purchase of sports equipment, organising coaching camps, improvement of other critical areas of infrastructure and for organisation of regional and national level tournaments. This scheme was started during the Eighth Five Year Plan (1992-97) and assistance is being provided under direct assistance to the NGO's/Clubs and under State releases. The following type of activities constitutes the package programme to accommodate various proposals from State Governments and other recognised sports associations etc. for promotion of Sports & Youth Activities in the N.E. Region :-

- ❖ Improvement of the provision of equipment, kits, etc. of various sports and adventure activities.
- ❖ Improvement in critical areas of infrastructure for sports and youth activities.
- ❖ Assistance for training and other promotional inputs for improving the performance of players of exceptional qualities.
- ❖ Organization of Regional and National Level Sports and Youth Activities.
- ❖ Organization of Adventure activities like Mountaineering and Expeditions etc.
- ❖ Youth Exchange programme.
- ❖ Sponsorship of outstanding sportspersons for participation in coaching and championship outside the country.

1.4 Sports Scenario in Meghalaya

The Sports and Youth Affairs department in the state of Meghalaya takes care of the promotion of sports and games and youth welfare programmes. It also monitors the functioning of the District Sports Offices, State Olympic Association, State Level Sports Associations, District and Sub-Divisional

Sports Associations and much more clubs and schools undertaking sports activities in the State. The Department also coordinates with the Sports Authority of India, North East Council, DONER; and the Ministry of Sports & Youth Affairs, Govt. of India. Plans and programmes for sports and youth development are checked out and Govt. approval obtained before it is executed. Financial assistance as grant-in-aid is extended to State Level Associations/ District Level Association/Clubs and Schools to carry out sports and youth activities. Coaching programmes are also organized by the Directorate and sometimes in collaboration with the State Associations before the teams are sent for participation at the Regional and National Level Tournaments. The organisation of Inter School tournaments to unearth talents at the School Level is a regular feature of the Directorate.

The Department also takes up the Government of India schemes like All India Rural Sports Tournaments, Sports Festival for Women, Promotion of Sports programme in the Schools, North East Sports Festival, and Games which requires a lot of funding from the State, especially for Block Level and State Level Competition and participation at the All India Tournament.

The Department also organizes Youth Welfare Programmes like Youth Festival for empowerment and capacity building of youth for realization of potentials of individuals, Quiz Competition to increase knowledge and awareness, extempore competition, Debate and group discussion from major youth activity programmes. During Youth Camp, singing, dancing, intermingling with the different youths, music, culture and talent exposition to showcase different abilities is considered a priority. Initiation into vocational training and entrepreneurship skills are also imparted during such Camps.

Youth and risk taking and Adventure are considered synonymous and hence individuals and organizations taking up Adventure Programme like mountaineering, caving exploration, trekking, hiking etc. are supported financially to organize competition as well as to take part in the Regional and National Championships.

The Government of Meghalaya vides Notification No: EDN-177/83/80 Dated 18th March 1985 had set up a separate Directorate for Sports and Youth Affairs with Headquarter at Shillong for administrative convenience and in the interest of Public Service. The function, power, and Jurisdiction of the Directorate are defined below:-

- The Directorate shall be responsible to the Government for execution and efficient management of all works pertaining to Youth & Sports activities and other such related matters.
- Any other work that may be entrusted by the Government from time to time. The jurisdiction of the Directorate shall extend to the whole State of Meghalaya.
- The jurisdiction of the Directorate shall extend to the whole State of Meghalaya.

1.5 Sports Schemes

The schemes under the Directorate of Sports are (i) Expansion of Physical Education (ii) Training of Coaches (iii) Youth Camps, National Youth Award and other services, Mass Rallies, assistance to Voluntary Organisations and Youth Welfare Affairs, National Integration Programme/Youth Leadership Training/ Youth Festival, assistance to State/District/Sub-Divisional Sports Associations (iv) Assistance for holding tournaments, assistance for construction of Outdoor and Indoor Stadiums (SSCM) (v) assistance to State Sports Council Meghalaya (vi) Assistance for improvement of playfields including school grounds, (vii) Development of sports and games, (viii) Rural Sports, (viii) Adventure Programme, (ix) Tournaments/Championship to be organized/sponsored by the Directorate and its Subordinate Offices (x) For running and maintenance of Indoor Sports Hall, Stadium etc. (xi) Sports Talent Search Scholarships, (xii) Procurement of sports materials to various Sports Clubs/Organisations (xiii) Running and maintenance of Indoor Sports Hall, Stadium etc. (xiv) Chief Minister's Youth Development Schemes and (xv) Intensive Sports & Youth Development Programmes.

1.6 Roles and Functions

The Directorate for Sports and Youth Affairs also takes up the Govt. of India schemes like All India Rural Sports Tournaments, Sports Festival for Women, Promotion of Sports programme in the Schools, North East Sports Festival, School Games which requires a lot of funding from the State, especially for Block Level and State Level Competition and participation at the All India Tournament.

State Sports Council of Meghalaya

The State Sports Council of Meghalaya was created in the year 1990-91. It is an autonomous body which implements the sports infrastructure requirements like Indoor and Outdoor stadiums, Basketball, Badminton courts, development of playground etc. approved and sanction by the Government on an annual basis. The hierarchies of the council are as follows:-

1. President - Minister I/c Sports and Youth Affairs
2. Vice President - Commissioner & Secretary to the Govt, Sports and Youth Affairs Department
3. Secretary - Director, Sports and Youth Affairs - Chief Engineer State Sports Council
4. Members
 - A Representative from the Finance Department
 - A Representative from the Planning Department
 - A Representative from the Education Department
 - A Representative from the Meghalaya State Olympic Association

The Council receives the Grants from the budget of Directorate of Sports and Youth Affairs for running the office, execution of plan schemes and maintenance of the infrastructure created.

Chapter-2

Objectives and Methodology of the Study

Sports have gained massive popularity all over the entire world and it has become a way of life. Sports serve a vital social and cultural function in society and helps in all-round development of human personality. It provides ample scope and healthy means for recreation and relaxation of the human mind and society. A healthy body is always recognised as important as a healthy mind. It provides opportunities for social interaction fostering peace and understanding among different people, nations, race, religion etc. Sports also provide platforms for the people and nations to compete with each other for achieving heights of excellence in human endeavour. From ancient times, yoga, sports and games, martial arts etc. have been the characteristics of our nation's history. It is not surprising therefore; that the same tradition continued and sports started receiving a great deal of attention in India since Independence. The vision is to develop the facility as an integrated indoor/ outdoor sports precinct of regional standard and to maximize use and sharing of facilities by providing function spaces, meeting and board rooms, etc. that can be shared by all users as well as available for public hire.

2.1 Objective of the study

The broad objectives of the study were to assess the extent to the scheme has succeeded in developing sports consciousness and mass participation in sports in rural areas, assess the extent to the scheme has succeeded in strengthening sports at grassroots level and to gauge its resultant impact, assess the effectiveness of the level of opportunity provided to rural as well as north-eastern youth to get noticed for further nurturing. The specific objectives of the study were as follows:

- ❖ Quality of the work (project-wise)
- ❖ Name of the beneficiary /club project wise
- ❖ Cost-benefit analysis
- ❖ Impact of performance sport-wise and on overall sport & youth development in the state
- ❖ SWOT analysis

- ❖ Social impact of the scheme
- ❖ Social acceptability of the scheme
- ❖ Feedback from targeted beneficiaries/groups
- ❖ Suggestions and recommendation for overall improvement of the scheme

2.2 Approach and Methodology

In order to measure the impact of the scheme on study indicators, the researchers employed a triangular of research methodologies to obtain both quantitative and qualitative information. The set of methodologies employed included those that involved measurement of the scheme success on the basis of already existing measures and measurement of the success of the programmes by constructing new measures.

Various records available with the concerned department involved in the implementation of the Scheme were examined to ascertain relevant information regarding implementation of the programme. Relevant data related to scheme infrastructure, annual action plan etc. were also obtained from the convergence departments, for the reference period of the study.

After careful examination of various records and secondary data, the following approaches were adopted for detailed investigation:

- In-depth discussions/interactions with project implementing officials and staff of the department at District/Block levels;
- Physical verification and assessment of the construction work carried out through field visits and by conducting an opinion survey for assessment of the benefits accrued by the club/beneficiaries.
- Document analysis; structured, semi-structured, and focus group interviews; and assessed capacity building among club members.

Evaluation work was carried out by Senior Researchers from the organization having experience of more than 8 years in the field of evaluation for getting the desired output. In-depth discussion and interactions with District/ Village council members, Club members, Youths etc. were conduct to get desired information during the study period (**February to March 2014**).

The Indoor/Outdoor stadium and playground constructed by the department were physically verified to gather information regarding quality of construction work and perceptions along with the satisfaction of stakeholders. Probing exercise: Verification of records related to contractors, quantity of materials assets created, meetings held, resolutions passed, audit reports, utilization certificates, quarterly/ annual progress reports and guidelines issued by the state governments were examined.

A combination of interviews, observation technique, photography, video writing, and voice recording, field notes were used to accomplish the overall evaluation process. The overall data collection methods were depended on the specific mixed methods design chosen for proposed evaluation. In general, both qualitative and quantitative data were collected. After considering the research question and determining a mixed methods design, we were determined how the data will be collected. To do this, we had determined which qualitative and quantitative approaches are appropriate. The methods chosen determined the precise procedures for data collection.

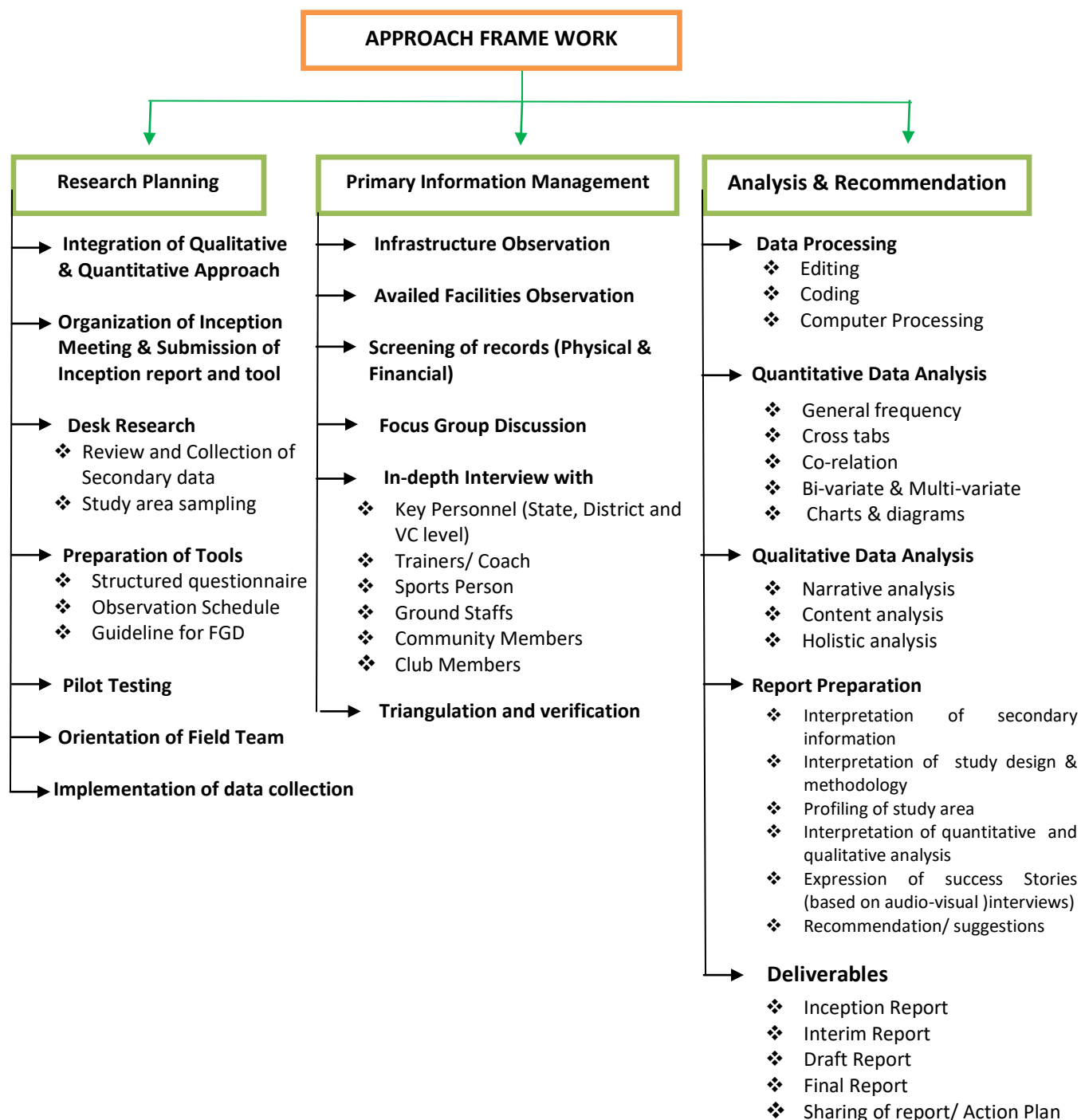

Observation technique is an effective tool of capturing visual information on the condition, use and effects of the various activities under the programmes. Both structured and unstructured observation was conducted in a natural setting to supplement the information provided by beneficiaries / officials and other representative related to the scheme with the help of a tally sheet.



2.3 Sampling Design and Sample Size

A total of 253 projects (sanctioned by the State Sports Council) have been evaluated from the financial year 2003-04 to 2012-13. This study was spread across all the 11 districts and the study evaluated all the projects implemented within this. There was 100 percent coverage of projects and no selection of blocks or districts was made as per ToR. The sample size of the study was as follows:

2.4 Project Execution and Quality Control

The fieldwork was carried out by a team of graduate/postgraduate interviewers, specially trained for the purpose of the study. Training of the field team was crucial for carrying out a study of such a sensitive nature where the quality of the fieldwork is of utmost importance. Both theoretical (regarding key concepts and techniques) and on-the field training were imparted to the teams to cover issues like:

- Study objectives
- Target segment
- Orientation to questionnaires
- Desensitization exercise, mock interviews and role plays
- Process to be adopted to approach the respondents
- Manner of canvassing questionnaires and possible ways to tackle sensitive / hostile attitude of the respondents.

During the conduct of the field-work due care was taken to adhere to the ethical standards. The respondents were interviewed under the condition of assured anonymity and provided full information on the purpose of the study. During the process, the respondents were given full rights to refuse to participate and were replaced to ensure sample coverage. Further, to ensure quality, continuous monitoring of the field-work was undertaken by the field executive, under the direct supervision of research professionals. Interviewers were accompanied by the supervisors to ensure quality of field-work. Scrutinizes of the schedules were done on daily basis on the field itself, to avoid discrepancies in the data collection and to ensure timely completion of field- work.

2.5 Data Entry and Analysis

The findings of the study are presented in the tabular form containing absolute as well as relative values. The values of explanatory variables are presented against the background variable in the tables. The quantitative finding of the study will be corroborated and elaborated with the qualitative research finding. The data analysis plan will be simple so that it can be understood easily.

Appropriate statistical test was employed to infer valid conclusions. The quantitative analysis of the data was done with the help of window based SPSS package. Qualitative data was analyzed through content analysis.

2.6 Report Writing

The findings of the study are being compiled into a report that incorporates the introductory material, literature review, and methodology section of this report. The study report also elaborates upon the criteria developed for the content analyses. Additionally, the report includes a discussion of the findings, the potential implications for the archival profession, and any difficulties discovered during the research process. Where the team discusses findings derived from content analyses, exemplary comments offered by the participants provided to add greater depth. The report is included frequency distribution tables and graphs of the findings, as well as a copy of the survey data collection instruments.

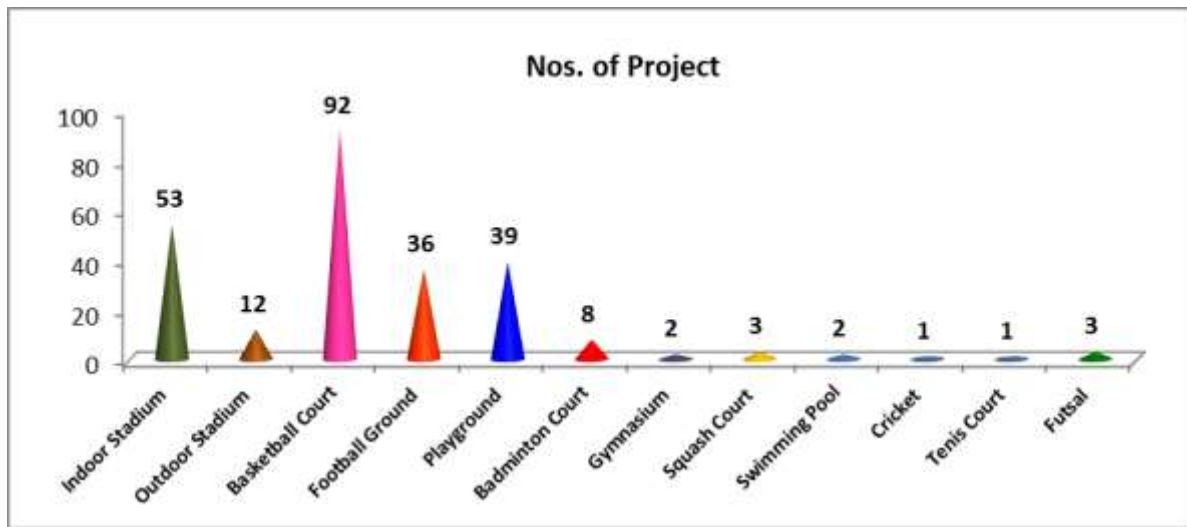
Progress and status of the Scheme

The Directorate of Sports and Youth Affairs takes care of the promotion of sports and games and youth welfare programmes in the state. It also monitors the functioning of the District Sports Offices, State Olympic Association, State Level Sports Associations, District and Sub-Divisional Sports Associations and much more clubs and schools undertaking sports activities in the State. The Department also coordinates with the Sports Authority of India, North East Council, DONER; and the Ministry of Sports & Youth Affairs, Govt. of India. Plans and programmes for sports and youth development are checked out and Govt. approval obtained before it is executed. Financial assistance as grant-in-aid is extended to State Level Associations/ District Level Association/Clubs and Schools to carry out sports and youth activities. Coaching programmes are also organized by the Directorate and sometimes in collaboration with the State Associations before the teams are sent for participation at the Regional and National Level Tournaments. Inter School tournaments are being organized to unearth talents at the School Level.

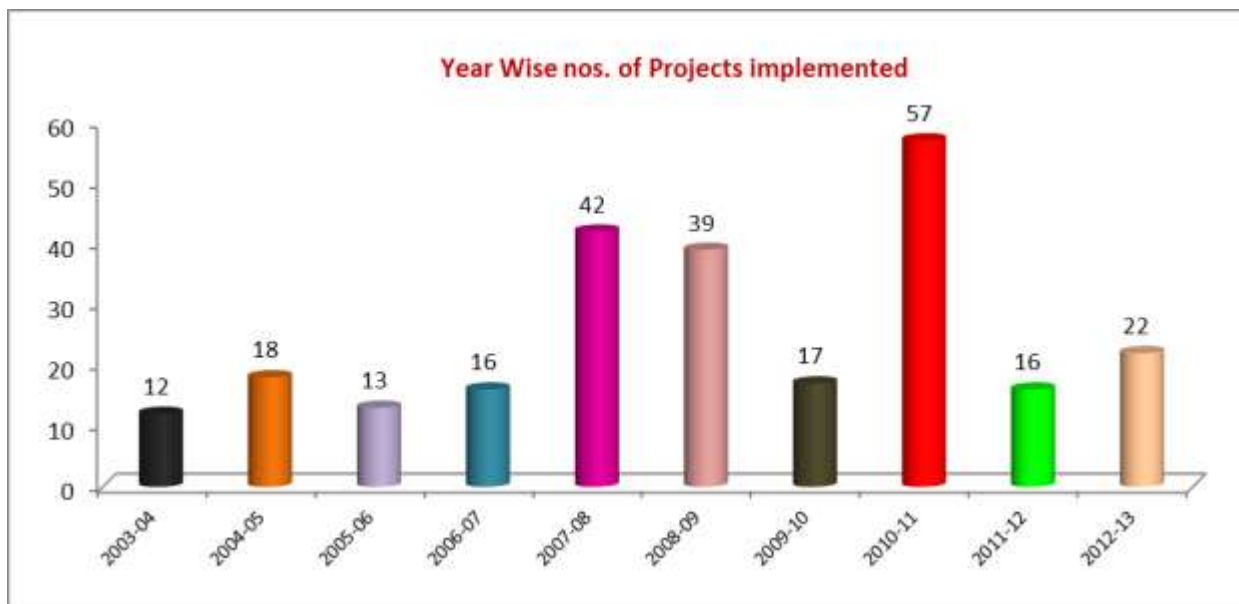
The Department of Sports and Youth Affairs have been facilitating the development of sports and games in a satisfactory manner. As per the requirement, they have tried to create the necessary infrastructure required for proper grooming, nurturing and channelizing the youth potentials in the state. Apart from these various other programmes for youth development like Youth Festival, National Integration camps, De-addiction Camps etc. are being organized at frequent intervals by the department.

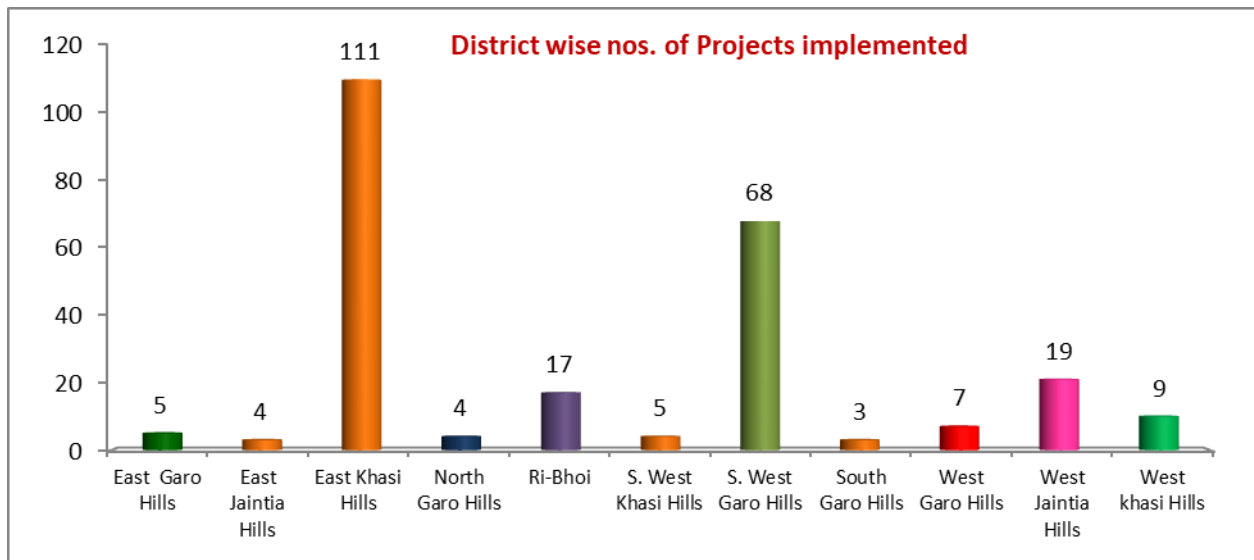

The above table and graph clearly indicate the details of sports infrastructure in the state. On the basis of the above data, it can be seen that, more attention is given to construction of Football ground, playgrounds and Indoor Stadiums. While least preference is given in construction of Badminton Court, Cricket ground, Gymnasium, and Squash.



It can be observed from the above graph that in the beginning period of the project the growth was a little slow as it was the initial phase of it. In the year 2003-04 the number of projects implemented were just 11 in number but with time the projects gained momentum with 2007-08 and 2010-11 being the peak years of the number of projects that were implemented in the state.



From the above graph the apparent difference between the projects can easily be seen with East Khasi Hills and South West Khasi hills being the two districts with a vast majority of implementations and a significant level below is East Jaintia Hills and South Garo Hills districts where as little as 3 projects each were implemented compared to these well doing districts which have 111 and 68 projects respectively. ***Out of 252 implemented across Meghalaya, a total of 41 projects were related to renovation, upgradation and improvement of existed sports infrastructures.***

3.6 Project-wise quality of works undertaken and performance

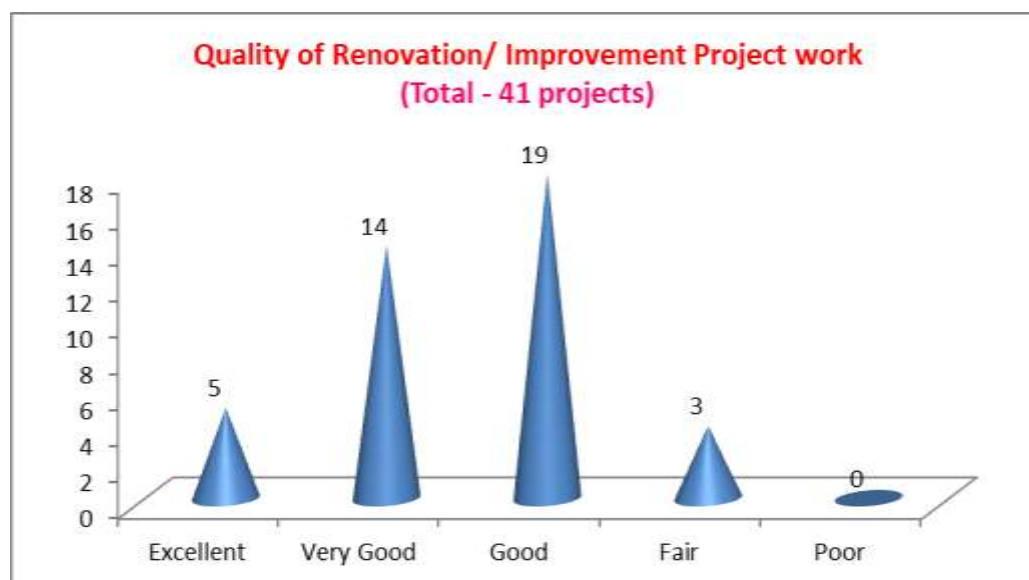
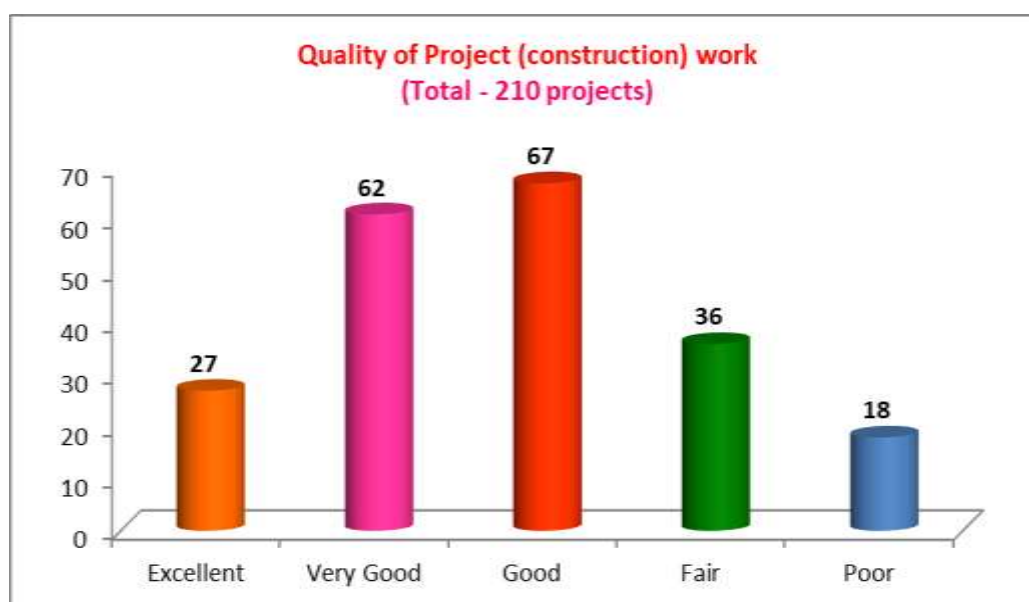
Improving quality and user/ stakeholder's satisfaction has received considerable attention in recent years. This study examines construction in terms of user/ stakeholder's satisfaction and quality. A framework was developed to evaluate the dynamics of user/ stakeholder's satisfaction and quality. An empirical analysis is conducted to explore user satisfaction in construction as perceived by user groups: public and private user.

There were 20 indicators to measure the quality of the project and satisfaction of stakeholders towards its implementation. Out of these 20 indicators, the 10 major indicators that emerged from the survey are as follows:

1. Commitment of all parties to the project.
2. Systematic design and management of the project.
3. Quality and quantity of materials.
4. Site quality inspection of materials.
5. Using technology with higher operational efficiency.
6. Proper allocation of fund, equipment and materials.
7. Systematic measure of quality and non-quality costs.
8. Accessibility/Cleanliness/Aesthetics
9. Condition of the constructed site
10. Sustainability and durability of project

At the project level, the user/ stakeholder assesses the contractors' performance in relation to three comparisons, all of which impact user/ stakeholder's satisfaction (Figure).

1. Comparison – between the quality of the construction, the user/ stakeholder's expectations and the adjusted goals for the construction
2. Comparison – between the quality of the construction process and the experiences, which have emerged during the process
3. Comparison – between the user/ stakeholder's expectations and experiences



The graph above indicates the quality of the projects that were implemented across the 11 districts. The measurement was done on a 20 measurement themes out of which 10 major themes (on 5 point scale: 5-Excellent, 4-Very good, 3-Good, 2-Fair and 1-Poor) were identified. The graph indicates the stakeholders to be satisfied with a large number of project implementation, with 194 projects fairing from good to excellent which amounts to 77 percentage of the construction work that was done. While 39 projects were reviewed as fair and about 18 that had a low level of satisfaction amongst the respondents.

The table below indicates the quality of infrastructure constructed for the development of sports in the state. The points were given based on observation, Interview, FGD and in-depth interview with concerned authority and stakeholders. Out of the total sampled projects, in most of the places the quality of work was

not found to be satisfactory. There is no proper supervision of construction and maintenance works by the concerned department. There is no proper provision for maintenance and renovation of sporting infrastructures in the state. Most of the infrastructures taken care by the Clubs/ Dorbars/ Schools/ Organizations etc. are not being maintained properly.

Results indicate that the need for contractors to improve performance relates mostly to quality assurance, handover procedures and material. Public were found to be less satisfied with the contractor's performance than user/ stakeholders. For a contractor, the main benefit of high customer satisfaction is the opportunity to remain a user/ stakeholder's partner in the future.

3.7 Cost Benefit Analysis of projects

The cost-benefit analysis is an economic evaluation, which aims to value costs and benefits of the project for the broad community, irrespective of the incidence of those costs and benefits. For the purposes of the economic evaluation, we are interested in the value of resources (broadly defined) that are created or consumed. Although information about transactions may be used to value resources, we are not directly interested in transactions that occur, although they are included (and netted out) to highlight the financial impact on particular stakeholders. The approach taken for the Cost-Benefit Analysis is consistent with the guidelines designed by the AMC Research Group Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi. There are a number of benefits that were unquantifiable, with slightly more unquantifiable benefits occurring under the development scenario.

A total amount of **Rs. 94,27,69,000.00** was spent on this project for the construction of indoor/outdoor stadium and playground in the state of Meghalaya during **2003-04 to 2012-13**. From the data that is available the total earnings from these constructions can be divided in three categories Hiring charges of the playground- Rs 1,57,13,436.00, Entry fee- Rs. 1,73,780.00, Car Pass- Rs. 1,02,200.00. The total amount of earnings being **Rs. 1,59,89,416.00**. The earnings are not enough even for the maintenance of these sports grounds let alone anything over and above the expenditure that was made¹.

Tangible and Intangible Costs and benefits

A purpose of this evaluation study is to provide an overview of the wide variety of costs and benefits that follow from the decision to utilize public funds to construct a new sports facility. This section provides a summary review of these impacts. In doing a cost-benefit analysis, we estimate both the tangible and intangible costs before moving forward with changes or a new direction.

The tangible costs factor heavily in making decisions involving large fixed assets such as construction of indoor/ outdoor stadium or a playground. Underestimating a tangible cost can lead to lower profits while overestimating tangible costs might lead to avoiding a potentially lucrative avenue. An intangible cost is an unquantifiable cost emanating from an identifiable source that can impact, usually negatively and overall performance. Many intangible costs arise from causes that are social, legal, or political - rather than being material in nature. Ignoring intangible costs can have a significant effect on a project/ scheme performance. A tangible cost is a quantifiable cost related to an identifiable source or asset. Tangible costs can be directly connected to a material item used in production or to conduct business operations. Tangible costs are often associated with items that also have related intangible costs. A tangible cost is the money paid to a new construction to replace an old one. An intangible cost is the experience and knowledge about the old

premises takes with them when it replace. Tangible costs represent expenses that are clearly tied to the item generating the expense. Some examples of tangible costs include:

- Paying employee wages
- Inventory, supervision and monitoring
- Assets such as equipment, land, or a new construction
- Renting or leasing equipment

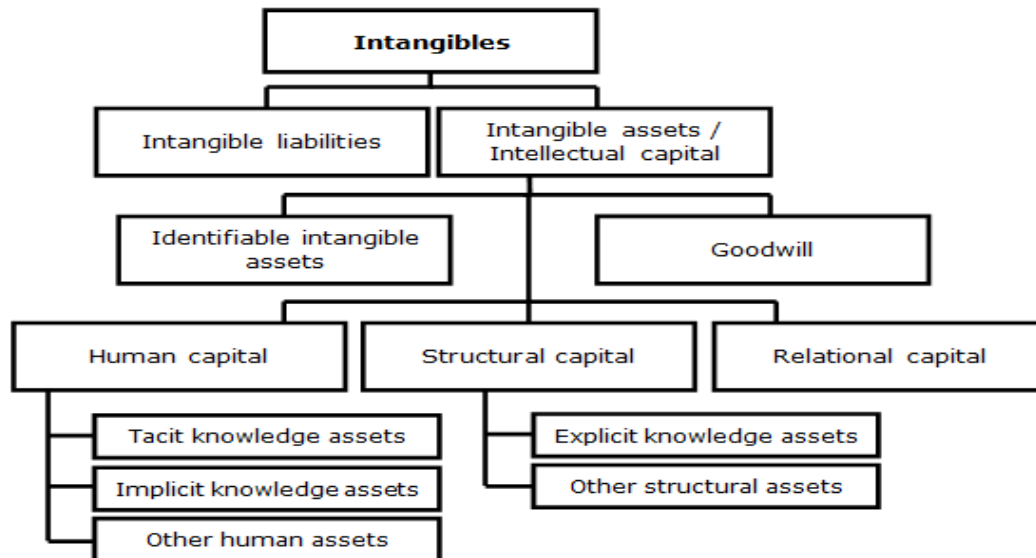
An intangible cost consists of a subjective value placed on a circumstance or event in an attempt to quantify its impact. Although intangible costs are more difficult to quantify, they have a real, identifiable source. Intangible costs can stem from variety of expenses including losses in performance, impairment to goodwill, decline in morale, loss of brand value or damage to brand equity. These may be contrasted with tangible costs, which are both identifiable and quantifiable. Intangible cost may also be contrasted with intangible assets, which are benefits that similarly cannot be directly measured.

As the sporting world today is becoming more competitive than ever, professional teams and individuals are always looking to gain that competitive advantage over their opponents and rivals. Tangible evidence) is becoming increasingly popular among professional outfits and if obtained correctly, the data can suggest areas of strength and areas of improvement. With most disciplines, there are many different methods for obtaining data (In respect of physical conditioning there are sprint test times, VO2 max etc.), however in relation to psychology there is not an obvious instrument which can fully detail an athlete's or team's mental status. This report discusses the tangible versus intangible evidence phenomena within sport psychology.

With many disciplines (e.g. physiology, strength and conditioning), in professional sports teams and athletes, tangible evidence is a means of progression. It assists coaches and trainers in devising progressive programmes that focus on specific improvements for individual athletes and teams. The data is an extremely useful asset to performance services when used to observe strengths and improvements, and where the focus of training should be. Therefore, many teams rely on numbers and data to sculpt their coaching and training programmes. In the psychology domain, numbers and data are not so easy to come.

International Accounting Standards are interested only in identifiable intangible assets which have to fulfil the requirements of identifiability, control, and existence of expected future economic benefits. Valuation of intangibles is still a very complicated task. For valuation of identifiable intangible assets the market, income, cost, and option approaches are used. The evaluation study dedicated to knowledge assets and intellectual capital. Other intangible resources are part of goodwill. Knowledge assets are stock of knowledge, so they

are a subset of intangible assets in the - broad sense. More popular is concept of intellectual capital. It is composed of three parts: human, structural, and relational capital.



Measures and variables

A questionnaire was designed that contained a total of 16 questions. Table 3.7 presents an overview of the relevant variables. The field researchers filled in the gender of the respondent (G). Then the interview started with a set of questions about the sport events held in Meghalaya, followed by questions on major sport events in general, questions about the future events and personal questions. The respondents' consumption capital was assessed using three questions. First, their ability to recall gold medal winners at the National game was tested. As only a few respondents could state at least one name, this variable was recoded into a dummy variable (NAMES). It can be suggested that respondents who can state many names have a high level of consumption capital. Moreover, respondents who are interested in elite sports (INTER) and who cheer for Meghalaya athletes (CHEER) are supposed to have a higher level of consumption capital as they are involved in elite sports and major sport events.

A set of intangible factors was assessed in the current study in order to investigate the importance of symbolic aspects and the non-use value of the sport events. The respondents were asked to state their level of satisfaction with the medal performance of Meghalaya athletes at the National game & state championship (SATIS) and whether they felt happy (HAPPY) or proud (PROUD) when Meghalaya athletes win many medals, whether they talked with friends/colleagues about Meghalaya medal success (TALK) and whether they thought it would be important for the reputation of Meghalaya that Meghalaya athletes win medals (REPUT). Afterwards, the interviewees were asked whether they thought that German athletes

would act as role models in terms of performance (PERF), motivation (MOTIV), fairness (FAIR) and sense of community (COMM).

The questionnaire finished with a set of questions about the socio-economic characteristics of the respondents. Interviewees were asked for their age using an open question. The metric age variable was recoded into five age group variables where every dummy variable had an equal size, that is, a similar number of respondents in each age group (AGE). The individual's highest level of education was assessed

using a closed question with seven answer categories (from 1=no graduation to 7=university degree) and a further category assessing other graduations. The variable EDU was obtained by recoding the categories A levels/ university entrance diploma and university degree into 1 and all other categories into 0. The telephone interview finished with an open question about the monthly net income of the respondent. The metric income variable was recoded into five equally sized income-group variables (INC) to allow better comparison of people with different incomes.

Sample characteristics: A simple random sample was selected and three quality measures were used to guarantee a representative sample (**835**) of the population. An overview of the descriptive statistics of the sample is provided in Table 2. With regard to the gender distribution, 63.2% of the respondents were males and 36.8% were females. The respondents had a mean age of 29 years, with an age range from 16 to 59 years. Altogether, 2.9% of the respondents had a migration background (i.e. person himself/herself or at least one parent was born in another state) and 17.4% had at least a university degree as highest educational level attained. The monthly net income of the respondents ranged from Rs. 4,000.00 to 35,000.00 with a mean value of Rs. 9,603.23 and a median of Rs. 6,400.00. A comparison of the sample characteristics to the overall population in Meghalaya shows that the sample can be considered representative in terms of gender, age, percentage of people with a migration background.

Data analysis: The data were analysed using SPSS 19. First, an exploratory data analysis was conducted to check the responses for content validity. All responses to the WTP questions seemed meaningful and the maximum value of stated WTP amounted to Rs. 500.00 in both questions. There were no indications for a hypothetical bias and therefore no cases had to be removed from the analysis. Second, descriptive statistics were provided to answer the first research question (what is the WTP for being top place in the medal table and for winning a gold medal in track and field?).

Third, regression analyses were carried out to answer the: which factors determine the WTP for being ranked first in the medal table and for winning a gold medal in track and field? Altogether, four regression models were estimated. In the first (Model 1) and the second model (Model 2), the WTP for Meghalaya being ranked in the medal table served as dependent variable, whereas the WTP for a Meghalaya winning a gold medal in track and field was the dependent variable in the third (Model 3) and fourth model (Model 4). In all four models, the consumption capital factors, intangible factors and socio-economic factors were included as independent variables. With regard to the age and income dummies, the youngest age group (up to 18 years) and the lowest income group (up to Rs. 5000) represented the reference categories. The four regression models have the following general equation:

The first (Model 1) and third model (Model 3) were logistic regression models to provide information about the determinants of whether respondents stated a WTP (higher than zero) or not. In the logistic regressions, the WTP dummies served as dependent variables (Model 1: WTP01 MEDAL; Model 3: WTP01 ATH). In addition to the logistic regression models, two log-linear regression models were estimated to check which factors determine the absolute value of WTP if a WTP was stated. In the log-linear models, the natural log of the WTP variables (Model 2: LN WTP MEDAL; Model 4: LN WTP ATH) was used because the variables were positively skewed. It represents the real relationships between variables and consequently improves the explanatory power of the models. To control for heteroscedasticity, regression models with robust standard errors were estimated. The check for multicollinearity indicated no problems of multicollinearity as all variance inflation factors were below 10 and all correlation coefficients below 0.9. Autocorrelation should not be a problem because of the cross-sectional design. All independent variables were theoretically supported suggesting that the application of a multivariate regression is appropriate. An α -level of 0.1 was used for all statistical tests.

Results

The descriptive statistics are summarised in Table 3.8. Only 36.6% of the respondents stated a WTP for Meghalaya being ranked in the final medal table and 31.4% stated a WTP for a Meghalaya athlete winning a gold medal in track and field. The mean values of stated WTP amounted to 6.13 (Meghalaya first in medal table) and 5.21 (gold medal in track and field). With regard to consumption capital, it is surprising that only 6.2% of the Meghalaya remember at least one name of a Meghalaya gold medallist in National Game. Altogether, 57.1% stated that they were interested in elite sports in general and 64.7% cheered for Meghalaya athletes at National Games and State Championships. With regard to intangible factors, the satisfaction with the performance of Meghalaya athletes at the National Games 4.13 on an average on a five-point scale. Almost four out of five (78.5%) respondents indicated that it would be important to the reputation of Meghalaya that Meghalaya's athletes win medals at National Games and State Championships and about two thirds of the respondents stated that it would make them proud (66.2%) or happy (65.6%). Almost half of the respondents (46.0%) talk to friends or colleagues about Meghalaya success during National Games and State Championships. The respondents mainly confirmed that Meghalaya athletes would act as role models in terms of performance (85.4%), motivation (91.8%), fairness (89.4%) and sense of community (86.5%) when they represent Meghalaya at National/ international competitions.

The results of the regression models are presented in Table 3.9. In Model 1, several variables have a significant influence on the dependent variable and therefore determine whether an individual stated a WTP for Meghalaya being ranked in the medal table or not. Individuals who remembered at least one name of a previous National Games gold medallist so far (NAMES), who thought that winning medals at National Games and State Championships would be important to the reputation of Meghalaya (REPUT), who stated that it would make them happy if Meghalaya athletes were to win many medals (HAPPY) and who regarded

Meghalaya athletes as role models in terms of fairness (FAIR) were significantly more likely to state a WTP. The results also reveal significant differences among age groups and income-groups. With regard to age, all age groups (except for the group from above 50 yrs) were less likely to state a WTP than the youngest age group that serves as a reference. On the contrary, individuals with higher income were more likely to state a WTP than individuals from the lowest income-group.

In terms of the absolute value of WTP for Meghalaya being ranked in the medal table, the findings of the second regression model (Model 2) indicate that individuals who feel proud when Meghalaya athletes win medals (PROUD) and males (G) are more likely to state a higher WTP. Moreover, individuals between 26 and 40 years of age stated a significantly higher WTP than individuals from the youngest age group. Respondents from all income-groups (except for the group from Rs. 10001-15000) stated a significantly higher WTP than respondents from the lowest income-group (Table 3.9).

The WTP for a Meghalaya athlete winning a gold medal in track and field is also determined by several factors. The results of the third model (Model 3) show that individuals who are interested in elite sports (INTER) and cheer for Meghalaya athletes (CHEER) were significantly more likely to state a WTP indicating that consumption capital is again important to whether an individual stated a WTP or not. Intangible factors also have a significant impact on the dependent variable as people who stated that it would be important to the reputation of Meghalaya that Meghalaya's athletes win many medals (REPUT), who feel proud (PROUD) and happy (HAPPY) when Meghalaya's athletes win medals and who consider Meghalaya's athletes as role models in terms of fairness (FAIR) were significantly more likely to state a WTP. Individuals aged 54 and older were significantly less likely to state a WTP than individuals from the youngest age group. Income had a positive influence on the dependent variable as all income groups were significantly more likely to state a WTP than the lowest income-group. In terms of the absolute WTP for a Meghalaya's athlete winning a gold medal in track and field (Model 4), individuals who are interested in elite sports (INTER) and who feel proud when Meghalaya's athletes win many medals (PROUD) stated a significantly higher WTP. Moreover, the WTP from the older age groups was significantly higher than the WTP from the youngest age group and individuals from the second income-group (₹601-1000) stated a higher WTP than those from the lowest income-group (Table 3.9).

Discussion and Conclusion

The current study provided evidence of the value of Sport Events success to the Meghalaya population using a CVM approach, where the WTP for Meghalaya being ranked in the medal table and for a Meghalaya athlete winning a gold medal in track and field was assessed. The distribution of the WTP values do not point to a hypothetical bias as all values were relatively low and no cases had to be excluded from the analysis. The average stated WTP for Meghalaya being ranked in the medal table (M 613.78) is slightly higher than for

winning a gold medal in track and field (M 521.21) indicating that the overall medal performance has a higher value to the Meghalaya population than a gold medal in a specific sport. However, both WTP values are lower than the WTP for amateur sport programmes in previous research in Meghalaya. Field Researchers has stressed that WTP for spectator sports and sporting success was lower than for active sport consumption. A comparison between the value of National Games and State Chamionshio/ Sport Evnts success and success at the Football League shows that the latter has a higher value to the Meghalaya. Consequently, the question arises as to why the WTP for Olympic success in the current study is substantially lower than the WTP for sporting success in other studies. Several explanations can be provided for this finding.

Another surprising finding was that only 6.2% of the population could name at least one Meghalaya gold medallist in National Games/State Championship. In view of the fact that many people stated that they were interested in elite sports and supported Meghalaya athletes, the recall of gold medallists can be considered poor. One explanation for this finding may be that Meghalaya did not win many gold medals in the National Games and therefore, many people could not remember the names of the gold medal winning athletes since their sports were usually not televised.

Nevertheless, consumption capital was found to be associated with the value of sport event success. This finding is consistent with research on the value of sporting success in football. When comparing the logistic regression models with the log-linear models, it is evident that consumption capital is particularly important towwhether individuals state a WTP or not, that is, whether they set at least some value on sporting success. It could also be argued that Sports Events success can increase the consumption of sports and therefore also people's consumption capital if they watch sports more often. Yet, the current study was not about Sports Events success per se and its influences on people's consumption behaviour, but rather about WTP and thus the financial evaluation of Sports Events success.

In addition to consumption capital, intangible factors were found to be important determinants of the value of success. In particular, the increasing reputation of Meghalaya through many sport event success and the role model of Meghalaya athletes in terms of fairness had a positive influence on WTP (Willingness to Pay). The findings of the study have also stressed the national importance that was attributed to sporting success. Moreover, individuals who felt proud and happy when Meghalaya athletes won multiple medals attributed to a higher value of sport event success. Thus, the current study supports the importance of intangible effects of sport events that were found to exceed the tangible effects.

Socio-economic factors were also found to influence the value of sport event success. With regard to income, individuals with higher income tend to state a higher WTP than people from the lowest income-group. This finding is in accordance with targeted sampled respondents on the determinants of WTP. The findings of the study have several implications for policy-makers and sport management.

- First, as consumption capital was found to be a determinant of the value of sport event success, it is important in case you would be interested in increasing the value of sporting success that people have the opportunity to generate more consumption capital, that is, through broadcasting sports on television. In this context it is crucial that more information about sports is provided, including during non-event periods.
- Second, as cost-benefit analyses mainly focus on tangible effects, it can be recommended that estimates on the value of sport event success and on the intangible effects of sport events are also integrated into cost benefit analysis. CVM (Contingent valuation method) would represent an appropriate approach in this regard. Tangible effects were not sufficient to justify the use of taxpayers' money for sport events.
- Therefore, as a third implication, estimates on the value of sport event success can be used to justify public subsidies for major sport events and also for elite sport development programmes. As sporting success has a certain value to the population, elite sport programmes that aim at winning Olympic medals can, and have to be.
- Fourth, Olympic/National/State and other event medal success may have an impact on the sport participation of the resident population. The population of a region may have health benefits as a result of increasing sport participation and grass roots sports. This effect is usually referred to as the trickle-down effect. Further research is needed to clarify whether there may be a trickle-down-effect as a result of medal success, that is, whether successful sports at the sport event lead to increases in participation numbers after the event.

The current study has some limitations that also provide directions for future research. First, the R^2 s of the four regression analyses show that the regression models only explain between 7.5% and 10.7% of the variation in the dependent variables. It seems difficult to explain the value of Sports Events (National, State and league) success. The scant body of research on the value of sporting success indicates that more research is needed in this field. The modest R^2 values suggest that further variables could be relevant to explain the value of sporting success to the population such as the level of individual sport participation and their interest in specific sports. These consumption indicators should be included in future studies on the value of sporting success. Moreover, it would be interesting to evaluate qualitatively why such a high share

of respondents did not state a WTP at all and assigned no value to Sports Events success. Furthermore, it would be interesting to compare the value of sporting success among different countries to investigate cultural differences.

3.8 SWOT Analysis

SWOT analysis is a strategic planning tool that can be used by State Sport Council of Meghalaya (SSCM) to do a situational analysis of the projects. It is a handy technique to analyze the present Strengths (S), Weakness (W), Opportunities (O) & Threats (T). The SWOT Analysis framework facilitates an organization to identify the internal strategic factors such as -strengths and weaknesses, & external strategic factors such as - opportunities and threats. It leads to a 2X2 matrix - also known as SWOT Matrix. The present SWOT Analysis involves the collection and portrayal of information obtained through various internal and external feedback during the field visits completion of construction work. This may help the department in studying their strengths and weaknesses with those from the analysis of opportunities and threats. Here are a few objectives that we've listed down for you to have a better understanding of why was SWOT necessary.

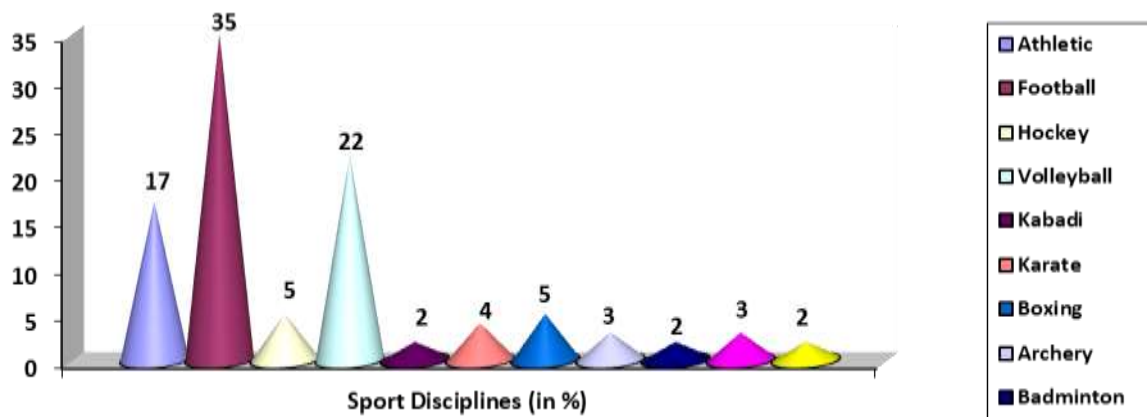
Chapter-4

Empirical Findings and Analysis

The findings of the study are based on the feedbacks collected from the target number of respondents during the field visits by the field investigators and experienced researchers.

4.1 Status of Respondents (Sportsperson)

Fig. 4.1: Status of Respondents as Sportsperson (in %)



Out of the total sampled respondents, a large proportion of the sportspersons (35%, 22% and 17%) was attached to Football, Athletic and Volleyball. as very few were associated with other disciplines. Few of the respondents stated the reason behind the less attachment towards the other sports discipline is because these disciplines require more equipments and training.

4.2 Age of the Respondents

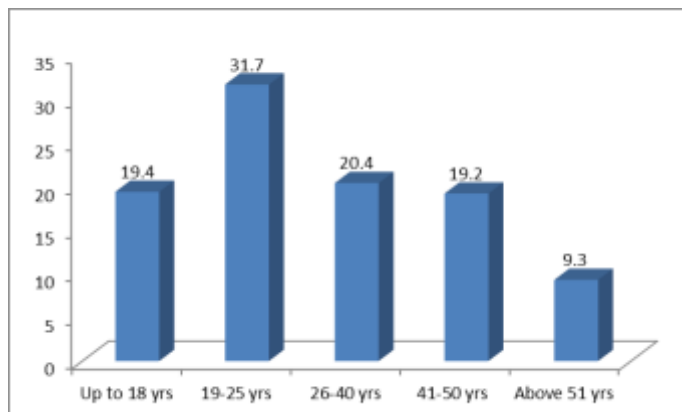
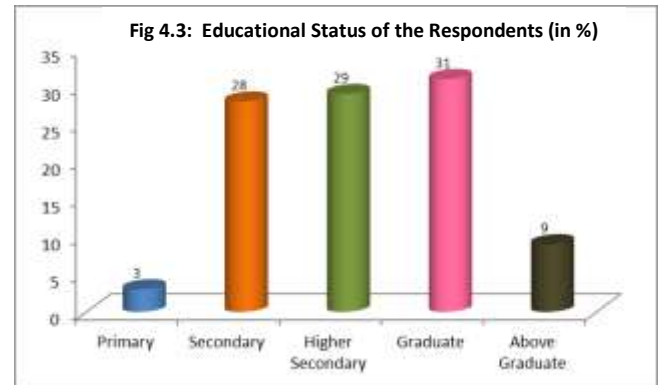


Fig. 4.2: Age of the Respondents (in %)

About three fourth of the respondents belonged to the age group 16-40 years, which is usually considered as the most knowledgeable group. While only 9.3% of the respondents were above 50 years and 19.2% of the respondents in between 41-50 years.

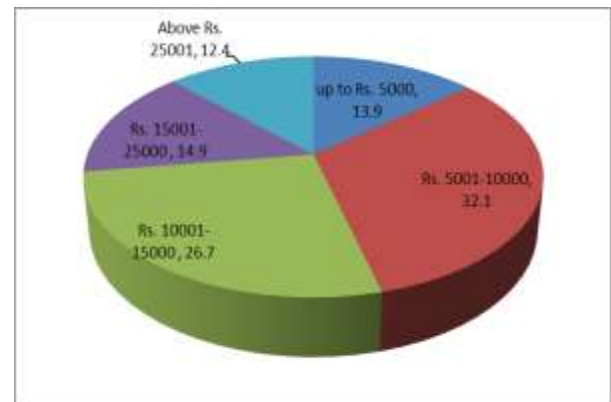
4.3 Educational Status of the Respondents

Amongst the respondents the largest proportion passed secondary examination, while 3% had studied till primary level. Almost all the respondents interviewed were literate. Among the respondents (Common people, Sports person and Opinion Leader), the largest proportion (31%) passed Graduate examination. Almost all the respondents among the sports persons category were literate. 28% out of the total Sports Persons are either secondary or more educated.



4.4 Monthly Income of the respondents

The monthly income of the respondents varied from Rs. 4,000 per month to 25,000 per month. But a major percentage (62%) for Common people, Sports person and Opinion Leader of the respondents earn in the earning group of Rs 5001 – 15000. More than one fourth of the respondents earned a monthly income as Rs.15001 to above 25000. More interestingly, the survey found around one fifth of the respondents monthly income is less than Rs. 5000/-.



4.5 Satisfaction towards quality of works

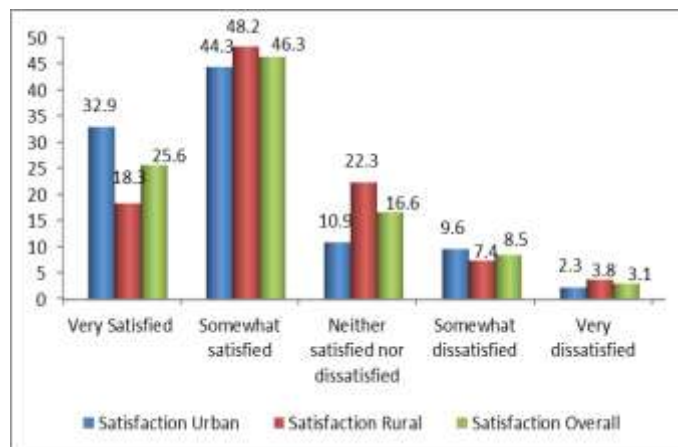


Fig. 4.4: Satisfaction towards quality of works (in %)

Around 90% of the respondents were satisfied with the quality of works, while 10% of the respondents were whether somewhat dissatisfied or highly dissatisfied with the quality of construction work of indoor/outdoor stadiums and playgrounds.

4.6 District-wise awareness regarding sports events

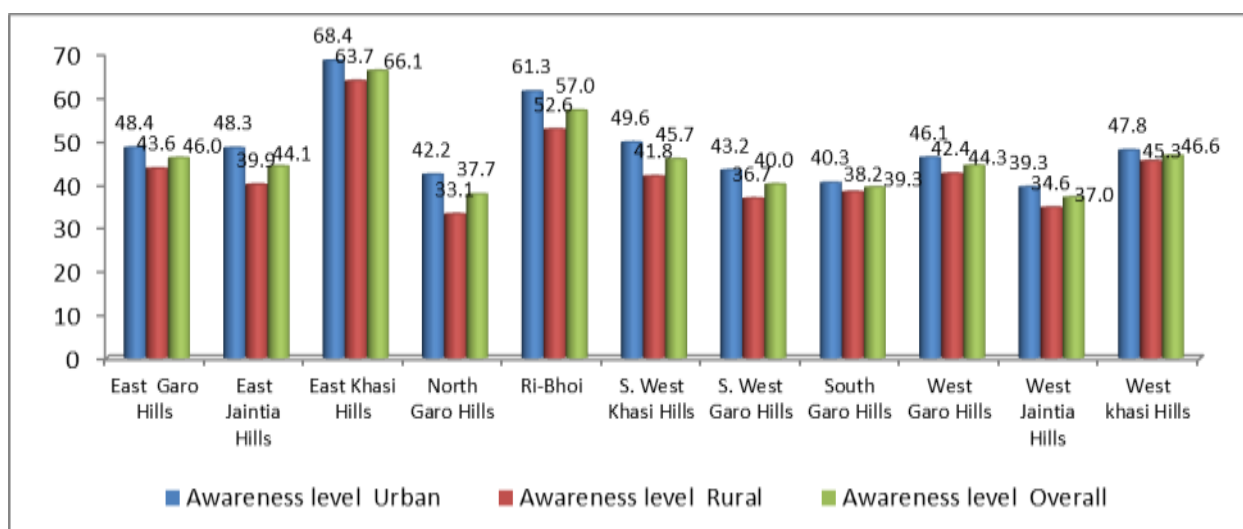


Fig. 4.5: District-wise awareness regarding sports events (in %)

The figure 4.5 clearly indicates the district-wise awareness amongst the respondents regarding sports events. More than 66% of the respondents from East Khasi hills were aware of most of the sporting events organized in their district, while only 39% of the respondents from South Garo Hills were fully aware of sporting events organized in their district. More than 40% of the respondents from the remaining districts were aware of sporting events organized in their district.

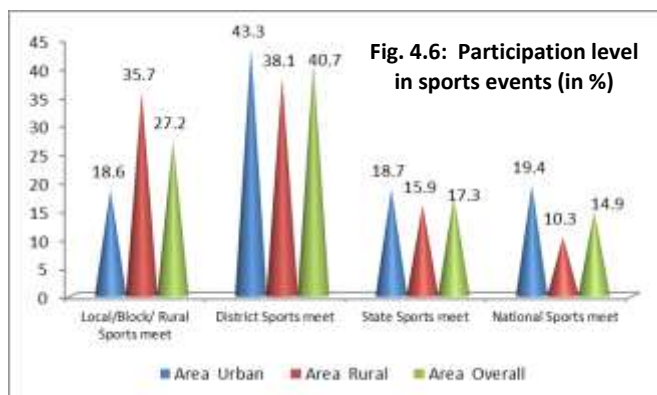

As far as the availability of sufficient sports materials in stadiums are concerned, more than 60% of the respondents are satisfied with the availability of sports material in stadiums in the urban area. Infrastructure, which is easily accessible, is the ideal situation for development of sports. The respondents (from rural area) were asked whether they have adequate infrastructure in/ near the village. Similarly, only 10% of the respondents (across all categories) said that they had stadium in/ near their villages. Less than one fifth of the respondents across all categories said that sports kits and equipments were available. Further, the availability of playgrounds in their villages, which is a must for development of sports, was cited

by less than half of the respondents, (across all the categories). The study shows that availability of infrastructure at block / village level was not the same as urban locality in all the eleven districts.

4.8 Participation level (Urban/Rural) in sports events: Sport Person

Amongst the sportsperson who said they have participated, were asked about the level in which he/she participated. Around 68% of the participants have participated at Local/ Block/ Rural/ District level, while 32% of them have participated in State as well as National meets.

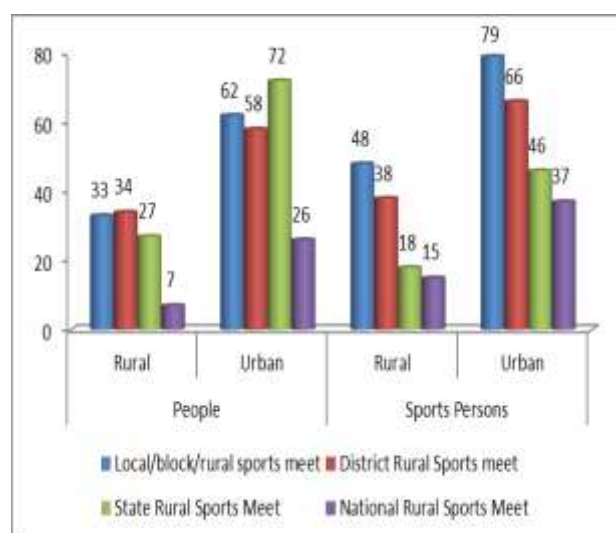


Among the sports persons who said that have participated, were asked about the levels in which he/ she participated. About three fifths (74%) of the sports persons have participated in than local/block/district and /or state sports meet. Some of the other observations by the participants are given below:

- ❖ Generally age certificates, which either issued by the school authority or Panchayat remains faulty in most of the cases. There is absolutely no machinery to check the faults.
- ❖ Sometimes in the thirst of medals, urban boys and girls are given rural certificates and take part in the rural meet. The chance of the rural sports persons become limited and the rural talents are not adjudged.
- ❖ Sometimes names of the sports persons are changed and second time his or her name is incorporated in the list to get a medal.
- ❖ Not only the fund is adequate, but also the sports infrastructure is inadequate.

4.9 Level of participation of sports person, if known: (People & Opinion Leader)

Respondents were asked about the level of participation of the sports person, if he is known. The study finds that people in general know about sports persons equally in the village as well as the district level. The expectation would be that people are aware about the sports persons at the village level more than they are about sports persons at other levels; however this is not the case as the village level meets are very irregular. In the case of the opinion leader however, more are aware of sports persons at the local /block levels.



4.10 Participation regarding success of the scheme

The Sport Programme (especially in rural area) operational for over three decades now, should have had an impact on the sports development in the state. More and more rural sports persons would have come to the fore and Meghalaya sports persons would have done well nationally/internationally. This has not happened. The goals of the Sport Programme seem to be nowhere in sight. In order to have a better understanding of the overall picture of the Sport Programme, respondents were asked about the successes and failures of the scheme. The study found that very few people in general talked about the program as a success. In fact the findings suggested that a majority of the people attested to the dismal performance of the program. This is true across all categories. Less than one tenth of the participants regarded the stated objectives of the programme having been achieved.

4.11 Participation towards success of the scheme

Respondents were asked whether they thought there are shortcomings in the scheme regarding promotion of sport programme. The study found that almost all (96%) said that there were shortcomings. People were further asked to detail out these shortcomings.

Among the various shortcomings mentioned by the people, inadequate fund was stated as the top most problems (especially in rural area). This is attested through another question, which specifically asks whether insufficient funds were a problem for organising sport events in a worthwhile manner. Almost all (99%) across categories said so. The respondents also mentioned about inadequate infrastructure and inadequate awareness due to inadequate communication to the people, as major impediments to the scheme meeting its goal. Corruption in disbursing funds and political interference was also mentioned by

the people. Even though people in all the districts mentioned corruption, the majority of people saying so belonged to rural area.

During the course of interaction with the respondents, the study also found that a large majority of the respondents said that there were shortcomings in almost every stage of the program. Even in East Khasi Hills, Ri-Bhoi and Jaintia Hills districts, where the status of sports seems to be good as compared to other districts, it was found that rural sports is not being conducted as per norms and quality is deteriorating, as the fund is a meagre one. There is no infrastructure in the village level or in the block level. There are plenty of playgrounds but to maintain those adequate funds are needed. As per the version of District Sport Officials, the fund is not adequate. There are many things to be done but in this small amount one cannot develop the infrastructure in the sports.

4.12 Details of events organized by DSO at District Level

The above table describes the various events organized by the Department of Sports and Youth Affairs at District level as well as at National level. While in all the districts coaching camps are being organized at regular intervals for nurturing the talents at district level. Apart from this, Football Tournaments, Inter School Athletic Meets etc. are also being organized each year.

Procedure for organising the Sport Events/Programme:

Respondents were asked about the procedure for organising the Sports meet.

- The process starts with the issue of letter to the concerned district authority/bodies for sending proposal for sports events along with a committee, venue and budget. A tentative date is also asked.
- The state government bodies related to sports send a proposal to the State Sports Council of Meghalaya (SSCM) and Sports and Youth Affairs Department.
- After approval the fund is allocated to them for conducting the events.

- The state government/ district authority posts an advertisement to the local newspaper for sending the certificate and bio-data to take part in the sports event.
- A committee has been formed to administer the procedures and after screening the certificates and CVs participants are chosen for events.
- At first the meet is convened in the block level, where, DSO, BDO, one coach and one local sports personality form a committee for the selection.
- From the list of each block candidates are chosen for district meet where Deputy Commissioner, DSO, Coaches, District sports personalities, and representatives from State Sports body form an expert committee to select participants for State meet.

4.13 Feedback on Suggestion for Modification of the Programme

A. Specific Modifications

Respondents were asked about any specific modifications that they would like to see in order to make the program more effective.

The modifications in the program suggested by the people included giving emphasis to the availability of more funds. A large proportion of the people talked about the need for having playgrounds in/ near the village as well as upgrading of infrastructure. This aspect was also given primacy by the sports officials.

B. Suggestions for strengthening sports infrastructure and facilities

Apart from suggestions on increasing funds and upgrading the infrastructure, people specifically also talked about the need for a creating a sports promotion network (like infrastructure, sports kit, playground etc.) at the grassroots level and setting up sports training institutes. Their task would be to localise the program, and make infrastructure easily accessible to the people who need it. A majority of Gram Panchayat officials also viewed that they were not contacted while selecting local talent or organising any such events. Thus, they should be given focus in organising events under the programme. The respondents were also asked to state their suggestions for improvements that would help the Sport programme to achieve the stated objectives and be a success.

Infrastructure: A large number of respondents said, there should be improvement in the sports infrastructure. This is to include setting up new playgrounds, maintain the existing ones and provision of adequate kits. They were of the view that kits are provided of poor quality and this in turn affects the development of sports. Secondly, kits for many sports are just not available. Further, there needs to be training institutes at the block level for promotion of sports.

Diet: Many of them said that the diet provided to the participants is inadequate. In certain cases (districts) respondents said that no diet is given at all. This is a serious departure from the GOI guideline. When contacted, the sports officials said that diet is always given, but the amount of funds available for diet has not changed in recent past. Therefore it is extremely difficult to provide adequate diet to the sports persons.

Training: Lack of adequate trainers was also cited as a problem and the suggestion was that trainers need to be properly trained and made available at the grassroots level. This would involve greater funds for training of coaches. Secondly, the recruitment process needs to be more transparent and should give adequate weightage to sporting record and expertise while selection.

Financial security: Many of the respondents were of the view that the procedure for selecting sports persons for stipend as well as the amount of stipend needs to be improved. They said that unless adequate financial support is provided, talented sports persons in the rural areas would be getting motivated. Secondly, without financial support, the deserving person will have to spend all his time in searching and securing some other livelihood option. This would mean that the deserving and talented sports persons couldn't give adequate time for their own training and for physical development. Few of the responders also said that talented sports persons should be given jobs to secure his livelihood options, so that he can concentrate his efforts in developing his skills.

Selection of sports persons: Many of the respondents said that the selection procedure for sports persons should be transparent and democratic. They opined that sporting talent is not recognised at the right time

and non-deserving people are selected. In order to streamline that they suggested that setting up a sports committee at the grassroots level for dealing with sports related activities including the selection of sports persons. In this committee, the suggestion was that the Panchayat be given the authority for selection, with the help of the officials. Further, they suggested the involvement of the gram sabha in the activities related to sports.

Creating awareness: Almost all people suggested that more needs to be done to increase awareness about the sport related activities in general and about the program in particular. While some people suggested that the awareness should to be created by the Panchayat, many others felt that the media should be used for creating awareness. All the respondents opined that unless people are aware about the various provisions in the program are aware about the mechanisms to demand that these provisions are made available to them and are aware of redressal mechanisms, the program cannot succeed.

Transparency: Most people said that there should be greater transparency in the functioning of the programme. This should be backed by a strong redressal mechanism in case of a sports person or anybody is unfairly treated. This would help reduce corruption in the programme.

4.14 Social Acceptability of the Scheme

Given the considerable amount of public money spent on developing major sports facilities, the non-economic benefits provided by these projects must be significant to warrant this level of spending. A particular individual's understanding of community cannot be easily identified, as one's experiences, thoughts, values and beliefs that inform their view of community is unique and impossible to replicate. A person's idea of what constitutes a community benefit is subjective and based on what is important and relevant to them and therefore cannot easily be defined.

Indoor-Outdoor Stadium stakeholders tended to view community benefit of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium in terms of providing an accessible sporting venue that provides an extensive range of quality facilities and programmes for pe

ople of all ages and abilities. Stakeholders generally agreed that Department of Sports and Youth Affairs and State Sport Council provides social, health and fitness opportunities for the community and identified a range of community benefits they attributed to the development of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium such as: increased participation and social cohesion; creation of a better lifestyle for the community; enhancing profile in the community; as well as increasing the number of visitors to the municipality and local businesses (i.e. economic impacts). Although stakeholders identified that Indoor-Outdoor Stadium provided

economic benefits, these were not explored, as the purpose of this study is to investigate the non-economic benefits associated with the development of sports facilities.

This study confirms that, from the perspective of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium stakeholders and facility users, Indoor-Outdoor Stadium provides a range of non economic benefits such as increased community visibility, enhanced community image and a range of social/psychic income benefits. Generally, Indoor-Outdoor Stadium stakeholders and users agree that the community benefits associated with the development of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium outweigh any costs, supporting the assertion that the non-economic impacts have justified the spending of public money on sports stadiums and arenas.

A number of study participants were convinced that Indoor-Outdoor Stadium provides a range of community benefits for their sport and sporting communities, but we're not certain of the value Indoor-Outdoor Stadium provides for the greater community, i.e. non-users. A limitation of the study is that the perceptions of non-users have not been investigated and assessments on the value of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium to the community have been presented from the perspective of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium stakeholders and users. Like other subsidised government facilities and services such as libraries and maternal and child health centres, non-users tend to place a value on sports facilities within their area due to the fundamental belief that participation in sport can be beneficial to individuals as well the collective community.

Although the results of the study provide an interesting insight into community benefit from the perspective of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium stakeholders and users, it would be useful to undertake further research focusing on non-users to determine if their views mirror those of the study participants. The idea that non-users value sports facilities due to the fundamental belief that participation in sport can be beneficial to individuals as well the collective community requires testing in order to substantiate this assumption. By qualifying non-user, as well as stakeholder and user, perceptions of the community benefit derived from the development of the Indoor-Outdoor Stadium will determine a more comprehensive understanding of the real value of this asset to the community. As the large majority of research into the benefits of sport facility development has traditionally focused on the economic impacts of such developments, further study of non-economic impacts, and more specifically the community benefit derived from sports stadia, makes a contribution towards remedying this imbalance.

4.15 Social impact of the Scheme

It is generally accepted that participation in sports provides an extensive range of benefits to individuals and the collective community. Internationally, government agencies are quick to point out that participating in

sports and recreation contributes to: community health and wellbeing; confidence-building and empowerment; social integration and cohesion; national and cultural identity; and a reduction in crime and vandalism

The subsequent funding of sports infrastructure, be it stadium or arenas, has often been justified because of these benefits and the universal perception that sports is good for individuals, the community and the economy. Benefits can be in the form of economic impacts, which have tied the flow of money in the economy and include such things as spending by fans at events, by players in the community, and money generated by spin-off business; or non-economic impacts which include social and community impacts, such as the communal experience of attending or participating in sporting events or the community identity, pride and sense of belonging one feels by identifying with a local team.

A diverse range of Department of Sports and Youth Affairs facilities were utilised by the facility users surveyed. The bar and change rooms were the most commonly utilised areas; this is a reflection of the fact that they are shared facilities that are accessed by representatives from all three resident sports. The data indicates facility users often utilise more than one area of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium, not just the sporting components of the venue. High usage of social and communal areas such as the bar, function room and meeting rooms supports the notion that the venue provides a social benefit – a meeting place for the community which “decreases the isolation of people”.

Facility users also indicated that they engaged in an extensive range of sporting activities and events at different Indoor-Outdoor Stadium. Facility users participate in these events as athletes, spectators, officials, staff and volunteers and the diversity of events and activities and the data confirms that sporting opportunities are accessible to local residents and sporting clubs as well as elite athletes and national teams. Major events, such as the National Youth Festival, Football tournament, Meghalaya Archery Competition, etc., provide the local community with regular opportunities to access premier sporting events. One user noted that Department of Sports and Youth Affairs and State Sports Council “allows me the opportunity to watch the elite of my sport and appreciate the efforts of others competing”. The enjoyment and engagement spectators receive from watching elite sport is just one of the many social benefits reported by the facility users who participated in this study. Generally, Indoor-Outdoor Stadium users believed that the broader community (non-users) had also benefited from the development of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium, although they often had difficulty identifying and articulating these benefits. Some broader -based community benefits identified included: improved local amenity and public safety; enhanced community pride and image; and increased social opportunities and leisure options for residents.

Social impacts of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium development cited by stakeholders included increased participation and social cohesion, and creation of a “better lifestyle” for the community. Some of the stakeholders confirmed that Indoor-Outdoor Stadium provides a social function, providing a venue where “people come in and grab a coffee, sit up in the stands and watch what’s on . . . it (Department of Sports and Youth Affairs and State Sports Council) has become a community meeting point”. Many facility users felt that the social components of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium would appeal to local residents as an accessible, safe and attractive alternative to cafes, restaurants and other community meeting places as well as providing free spectator access to elite sports facilities and activities. There was a perception that despite a heavy emphasis on the elite sport at Indoor-Outdoor Stadium, the non-elite sports community and local residents had also benefited from this development.

Facility users generally felt there were minimal costs or negative impacts associated with the development of Indoor-Outdoor Stadium, and any concerns resulted from perceived inadequacies in the provision of ancillary facilities and services rather than opposition to the development itself. The costs identified by intercept interview participants primarily came from users and included: multi-use nature of venue detracts from a club environment; and the alleged poor quality of physical infrastructure has adversely impacted on club membership and reputation. Overall, stakeholders and facility users reported mixed views regarding the impact that Indoor-Outdoor Stadium has had on their club and sport. Overall, study participants acknowledged that Indoor-Outdoor Stadium definitely provides a community benefit for their sport and sporting communities, but they were not certain of the value Indoor-Outdoor Stadium provides for the greater community, i.e. non-users.

4.16 Impact on Sports and overall youth development

Sports have the potential to impact the basic parameters of any Nation – be it National confidence, health or the very ideology of fair-play. Unfortunately, empirically this sector has been given little importance. Furthermore, in terms of Government set up, it is a part of neither the education sector, nor the health sector and it does not enjoy budgets that global giants receive in sport. This arcane approach to sport has ensured that India struggles as a nation when it comes to building a national competitive spirit in our youth, as well as the performance at international level in Olympic sport. But sport is an industry that has huge opportunity. Major competitions are set up in 3 or 4 major team sports that vie for television presence, as well as cater to adulating fans.

Modern sports and games especially where youths are more inclined have been given additional thrust and intensified training. Various steps are being taken towards making every youth from both

urban and rural areas to participate actively in sports, physical education and youth activities for achieving good health, high degree of fitness, increased performance in academics, accelerated individual productivity and overall development of their personality.

Both priority and non-priority sports discipline task have been identified to encourage and assist youth from non-popularize areas. Even traditional games are also being given due recognition. While sports-related activities are considered important aspects of overall youth development, yet the department is also organizing special events especially for the youth for becoming a responsible citizen and pillar of society. Towards this goal, youth festivals, an awareness programme on culture, HIV AIDS, environment, social malaise, career guidance, leadership training etc. are being conducted. The department is adopting a holistic approach to develop both physical and intellectual capabilities of the youth. These aspects have helped in increasing youth participation in sports related activities in the state. Every year different programmes are being organized at National/State/District level in different sports discipline. Some of them are as follows:

- ❖ Interschool tournament in Table Tennis, Basketball, Volley Ball, Badminton, Archery etc. is district level.
- ❖ Interschool Athletics.
- ❖ Interschool football tournament for boys and girls of different age groups.
- ❖ Seminar/Clinic/Workshop on different sport discipline.

Indoor/outdoor stadium and Playgrounds as Community Gathering Spaces

A playground with a unique and innovative design is a destination, attracting families and visitors from all over. Themes and imaginative concepts create a one of a kind experience that is a focal point for the community and an inspiring place to play those kids will want to visit again and again. State Sports Council of Meghalaya (SSCM) pushed the limits of conventional playground design to create an iconic, destination playground for their rapidly growing community. Their mission was to change the way the community experiences their local playground and create a space that served a diverse group of all ages and abilities. The result is truly one of a kind playground that unites futuristic design with the natural topography of the environment. Since implementation of the scheme, the Indoor/outdoor stadium and Playgrounds has been extremely popular with the residents of Meghalaya across the 11 districts, young and old, as well as visitors who are coming from across the district/ city by the busload.

Community playgrounds can also provide an economic impact with increased foot traffic on the way to and from their location. This could translate into more advertising opportunities and more customers for local businesses. There are also job opportunities for city workers and an increase in property value from revitalized areas. Well-designed playgrounds support the health and development of the whole child and the whole community. For a better tomorrow, we play today.

Indoor/outdoor stadium and Playgrounds Serve the Entire Community

Building Indoor/outdoor stadium and playground that serves the entire community are seem overwhelming but not to worry. SSCM created a step-by-step guide that breaks down the process to make it easy and fun. Every community is different, and SSCM helps to design a Indoor/outdoor stadium and that is unique to their goals and needs. **Top 10 Benefits of Indoor/outdoor stadium and Community Playgrounds are as follows:**

1. Playgrounds are fun for children and families
2. Children gain self-confidence and increased self-esteem when they master an activity that was previously challenging
3. Free activity for families
4. Growth of kids' creativity and imagination
5. Increased physical activity helps fight childhood obesity
6. Opportunity for parents, grandparents or caregivers to engage with children through play
7. Reinforce and build social skills when kids play with other children and make new friends
8. Multisensory experiences help to build a child's brain more quickly

Families that play together, stay together. Indoor/outdoor stadium & Community Playgrounds and recreation programs are a means to provide families opportunities to spend important quality time together to build strong family bonds. Indoor/outdoor stadium & Community Playgrounds are a tangible reflection of the quality of life in a community. They provide identity for citizens and are a source of community pride. Community Playgrounds and recreation services are often cited in surveys as one of the most important factors in determining the livability of a community.

The Indoor/outdoor stadium & Community Playgrounds contributes to Meghalaya's vital identity. Well-maintained, accessible Community Playgrounds and recreation facilities are key elements of its strong, safe, family-friendly community. Community Playgrounds and recreation opportunities encourage citizens to be engaged in their communities – as volunteers, stewards, advocates and students. Community recreation reduces alienation, loneliness, and anti-social behavior. Community Playgrounds and recreation programs provide places for healthy activities that are accessible by persons of all ages and abilities. Community Playgrounds have a value to communities that transcend the amount of dollars invested or the revenues gained from fees. The DSA strives to build a sense of public pride and cohesion amongst all people as significantly impact the quality of life in the community.

Sports and Youth Development

Sports can be a powerful tool to promote child and youth development. By providing opportunities for young people to develop transferable life skills - characteristics such as leadership, perseverance, social and moral character, self-esteem, commitment to teamwork, problem-solving, and organizational ability - sport help participants realize their potential as productive employees and citizens. Research proves that physical education and sport play an important role in school life increasing school enrolment, retention and access to education and fostering academic achievement. Sport also offers an important avenue for creating youth employment opportunities. Sports are vital to the holistic development of young people, fostering their physical, social and emotional health. The benefits of sport reach beyond the impact on physical well-being and the value of the educational benefits of sport should not be under-estimated. Physical education and sport also build health activity habits that encourage life-long participation in physical activity. This extends the impact of physical education beyond the schoolyard and highlights the potential impact of physical education on public health. The sporting events also aim to promote and develop other aspects of education such as school attendance and leadership. Sports do not inherently provide positive educational outcomes.

Community benefit is a term used frequently in a Meghalaya government context to justify the construction of sports facilities that require initial and ongoing financial support from the community. The purpose of this evaluation study is to investigate the community benefit derived from the development of a new sports facility, in this case the State Sports Council of Meghalaya, and examine community (user) perceptions to verify claims that the venue delivers a range of community benefits. Interviews were undertaken with both facility users and key stakeholders at the venue, and the data were qualitatively analysed to identify specific incidents and coded into concepts to identify predominate themes or patterns: social/psychic impacts; community visibility and image impacts; developmental impacts and political impacts. The findings of this study indicate that, from a user perspective, DSC provides an extensive range of noneconomic benefits such as increased accessibility, exposure, participation and success. The majority of facility users stated that the development of DSC has had a positive effect on their sport, sporting community and sporting experience. It is evident that a considerable amount of public money is spent on developing major sports facilities despite the fact that these funds could be spent on a myriad of other high priority and equally worthwhile city projects. Governments deem the development and subsidisation of sports facilities as justified because the benefits they provide the community appear to outweigh any financial costs, even though the evidence indicates that there is no economic benefit derived from the development of major sports stadia and arenas. Consequently, the noneconomic benefits provided by these projects must be significant to warrant this level of spending on sports facilities. The non-economic impacts are best categorised as:

1. Social/psychic impacts – which generally refer to the enjoyment provided by sports and sports facilities to citizens in a community;
2. Community visibility and image impacts – which capture the concept that a city or locality may experience benefits from being associated with a major sports facility or team;
3. Political impacts – which refer to the political costs and benefits that flow from a sports facility; and
4. Developmental impacts – which refer to physical redevelopment of the area immediately surrounding and in the district encompassing a new sports facility.

4.17 Success Stories

Under the **National Youth Festival (2009, Amritsar – Punjab)** the youths were drawn from all the seven districts of the State and mixed together in groups named after the rivers of the State; Umiam, Umtrew, Ganol, Simsang etc. There were around 600 participants including the group leaders, youth leaders and Departmental Officials. The programmes contents ranges from Aerobics, to fun games; discourses by learned Resource persons who were from different professions on HIV/AIDS awareness. Natural Disasters and the need to be in preparedness, Career Counseling, Leadership Training,

entrepreneurship training, survival strategies, Mass Media, Competitions on extempore, Singing, Drama and fancy dress were a huge draw.

National Games, Guwahati (9 February 2007 to 18 February 2007): Meghalaya teams qualified to take part in 1) Athletics 2) Football 3) Karate 4) Equestrian 5) Boxing 6) Judo 7) Archery. The teams were prepared by the respective State Associations under the banner of Meghalaya State Olympic Associations. Although medals won were less in quantity, yet the spirit behind it and the improvement it showed over the previous edition cannot be denied. The State won two bronze medals in Boxing at National Game, Hyderabad (**2002**), whereas in Guwahati 3 bronze and 1 silver medals were won. Also in Guwahati Games, particularly, Football, State team does exceedingly well; the team defeated the giants in Indian Football, Punjab and Bengal, The team ultimately reached the Semi-Final and secures a bronze medal which is highly credible, considering a stiff better opponent teams. The year **2013** proved to be one of tremendous success for Meghalaya in the state's favorite sport, football. The progress made was seen both at the senior and, very encouraging at the junior levels and it will be hoped by the fans of the state that the momentum can be carried forward into the next year and beyond. The path to success began with the Meghalaya U-16 Boys team finishing a commendable third in a national football tournament, held in Bhubaneswar (**2013**).

The Meghalaya Archery Competition is celebrated every year in the Polo Ground of Shillong which is situated in the East Khasi Hills. April- May is the perfect time to hold this grand festival. This festival not only allures participants from different corners of India but also attracts the attention of many visitors who come down to Meghalaya to witness this mega occasion.

- State Level Subroto Cup Football Tournament 2012 was conducted successfully from 6th – 14th August 2012 in two sections, one section for Boys Under-14 & U-17 w.e.f. 5th – 10th August 2012 and one section for Girls U-17 w.e.f. 9th – 14th August 2012.
- The Boys Teams reported on 5th August 2012 and the tournament started from 6th August 2012. The Teams of both age group were divided into two groups one group comprises of 4 teams each and another group comprise of 3 teams each. Two top teams from each group will qualify for the semi-finals. The final for Boys section played between Govt. Higher Secondary School, Jowai and Mynken Higher Secondary School, Umroi, Ri-Bhoi District, Govt. Higher Sec. School won by 2 goals to Nil and represented the State in the age group of U-14. Another final in the age group of U-17 played between Amwi Jarain Secondary School of Amlarem and Sibsing Memorial Higher Sec.School of Nongstoin; Amwi Jarain Sec.School won the match by 4 goals to Nil and represented the State in the National Level. In the Girls Section U-17 teams reported on the 9th August 2012 and the tournament started from 10th August 2012 the same procedure were followed as in boys section. The final were played between Tyrsad Higher Sec. School & Mynken Higher Secondary School, Umroi Ri-Bhoi District, Tyrsad Higher Sec. School, East Khasi Hills Shillong won the match by 2 goals to 1 and represented the State in the National Level.
- The Meghalaya Aids Control Society in collaboration with different Red Ribbon Clubs (RRC's), Shillong had organized International Youth Day 2012 on 11th August 2012 at MUDA Complex, Police Bazaar, Shillong.
- National Folk Dance-Yatra festival was held at District Library Auditorium, Jowai on September 10, 2012 which was graced by Regional Director, ICCR, Mr. Manish Singh. The programme was organized by North East Zone Cultural Centre, (NEZCC), Dimapur in collaboration with Meghalaya Arts & Culture Department.

Chapter-5

Conclusions and Recommendations

Traditionally stadium buildings worldwide are of substantial negative feasibility owing to their limited day to day use. However the new technology changes this model through the provision of a highly cost effective, innovative and internationally patented solution that addresses the problem of under utilisation.

The construction of a new stadium can often create legacy issues, but this new technology allows these problems to be addressed whilst also creating long term and sustainable revenue growth. The technology is a highly cost -effective and innovative product that will address the under utilisation of sports stadia globally. Using this proven engineering technology, part of a stadium can be converted into a flexible function and entertainment space.

The patented solution which is rapidly deployable and retractable, neatly separates the entertainment space from the playing area of the stadium (without any impact whatsoever on the pitch) at the push of a button. The newly created arena is then available as a multi-use theatre venue suitable for exhibitions, concerts, weddings, broadcast screenings, indoor sports (e.g. tennis, boxing, basketball etc.), conferences, corporate launches, disaster recovery centres, family shows, and many more events.

The technological solution has been designed by world-renowned specialists in Stadium construction, with consideration for the specific requirements of both the core sports utilising the external playing area, and the event users utilising the recently created internal arena. For example, the unique partition is located behind the touchline for football, so that it doesn't interfere with the playing surface. The sight lines have been designed to maximise the audience's enjoyment of the internal entertainment, without having any detrimental impact on the viewing of the core sporting activity when the arena is not in use.

The conclusions and recommendations based on the feedback from the beneficiaries as well as from the officials of the concerned department are as follows:

- ❖ The Department of Sports and Youth Affairs have been facilitating the development of sports and games in a satisfactory manner. As per the requirement they have tried to create the necessary infrastructure required for proper grooming, nurturing and channelizing the youth potentials in the state. Apart from these various other programmes for youth development like Youth Festival, National Integration camps, De-addiction Camps etc. are being organized at frequent intervals by the department.

- ❖ More focus is given for Football ground, playgrounds and Indoor Stadiums. While the least preference is given in construction of Badminton Court, Gymnasium, Squash Court and Swimming Pools. Most of Indoor and Outdoor Stadiums are located in the urban areas, while playgrounds and football grounds are located in both urban and rural areas.
- ❖ The maximum number of sports infrastructure is created in East Khasi Hills District, while the least number of Infrastructures is created in South Garo Hills district. There is no proper maintenance and repairing work being done in most of the stadiums. There is also a shortage of coaches in few of the stadiums.
- ❖ Most of the sports personnel were of the opinion that there needs to be substantial increase in the reward money/scholarship they are getting.
- ❖ Every year, financial assistance is being given to club and associations under different schemes such as: Youth Welfare Programme, Rural Sports, Adventure Programme, Development of Sports and Games, Playground etc. During the last three years there has been increase in the number of assistance given to the Clubs/Association under different schemes. While there has been no increase in the financial aspect. Today in the present scenario where there is rapid inflation, it's very difficult for the Clubs/Associations to cater to their sports needs in a substantial manner.
- ❖ A total amount of **Rs. 94,27,69,000.00** was spent on this project for the construction of indoor/outdoor stadium and playground in the state of Meghalaya during **2003-04 to 2012-13**. From the data that is available the total earnings from these constructions can be divided in three categories Hiring charges of the playground- Rs. 1,57,13,436.00, Entry fee- Rs. 1,73,780.00, Car Pass- Rs. 1,02,200.00. The total amount of earnings being **Rs. 1,59,89,416.00**. The earnings are not enough even for the maintenance of these sports grounds let alone anything over and above the expenditure that was made
- ❖ In almost all the districts there is shortage of training personnel. The department also needs to focus on the maintenance and renovation of these facilities at regular intervals.
- ❖ About three fourth of the respondents belonged to the age group 16-40 years, which is usually considered as the most knowledgeable group. While only 9.3% of the respondents were above 50 years and 19.2% of the respondents in between 41-50 years.
- ❖ Around 90% of the respondents were satisfied with the quality of works, while 10% of the respondents were whether somewhat dissatisfied or highly dissatisfied with the quality of construction work of indoor/outdoor stadiums and playgrounds.
- ❖ More than 66% of the respondents from East Khasi hills were aware of most of the sporting events organized in their district, while only 39% of the respondents from South Garo Hills were fully aware of

sporting events organized in their district. While more than 40% of the respondents from the remaining districts were aware of sporting events organized in their district.

- ❖ As far as availability sports infrastructure is concerned, more than 40% of the respondents are satisfied with the availability of playground, while only 10% of the respondents are satisfied with the availability of stadiums. Most of the respondents are highly dissatisfied with the shortage of coaches and honorarium allotted for sportspersons.
- ❖ Most of the respondents have pointed out the reasons behind lack of effective implementation are inadequate funds, inadequate infrastructure, corruption in disbursing funds and inadequate communication.
- ❖ More than 60% of the respondents are satisfied with the availability of sports material in stadiums, while around 36% of the respondents are not satisfied with the availability of sports material in the stadiums.
- ❖ A large proportion of the sportspersons (35%, 22% and 17%) were attached to Football, Athletic and Volleyball respectively. As very few were associated with other disciplines. Few of the respondents stated the reason behind less attachment towards the other sports discipline is because these disciplines require more equipment and training.
- ❖ The respondents across all categories mentioned that there is a severe dearth of financial resources for the nurturing and promoting the rural talents. This is because; most of the districts have focused on infrastructure rather than on nurturing of the sports persons.
- ❖ School playgrounds in the project area put positive impact on children's learning and development, in particular, school readiness of pre-school children, increase attendance rate of primary school, decreasing drop out, friendly environment, etc.
- ❖ Improvement in the physical and mental health of children has occurred as a result of play facilities in the school premises.

Suggestions and Recommendations

- Conduct of concurrent monitoring at the grass root level by independent monitoring agencies to verify the short comes of infrastructure facilities at the grass root level. Government should plans to take up the exercise of geo-tagging for all projects on a mission mode. The space technology is being used at the grassroots level for not just "visualisation of the assets" but also for mapping terrains to undertake other developmental works. The use of this technology will be helped streamline the implementation of schemes, monitor them efficiently, and draw up plans for the future. "Geo-tagging

also enables us to develop a future course. Essentially, it gave us a sense of what we are doing and what we need to do differently.

- The Indian Olympic Association should hold national Games once in every two years i.e., six months before the Olympics and six months before the Asian Games. The minimum facilities for the various sports and games should be provided at the village, the taluka, the district, state and national levels. These should include laying tracks for athletics and play fields for basketball, football, kho-kho, kabaddi, wrestling or many other games popularly in the area at the village and taluka levels. More facilities with large size stadia must be set up both at the State and national levels.
- This should be the responsibility of the States' Sports Council, the District Sports Offices and the Schools' Games Federations. At the national level, NIS Patiala, should work in collaboration with the National Sports Federations in coordinating and developing this programme. District and State Sports Councils should undertake functions like organising sports festivals at all levels starting with villages, districts and the State level. The All India Council of Sports should be vested with more powers to make its role much more effective as a coordinating and supervising body for the promotion of sports in the country.
- Mass media, like AIR/TV must be effectively involved in promoting sports and health consciousness and inculcating the habit of physical exercises as a way of life. They must also consider devoting more time to games and sports. TV and AIR may develop a policy for popularisation of games and sports. The Films Division can help in these programmes by developing films libraries and in promoting the distribution of films on physical education, sports and games.
- There needs to be priority given for construction of mini Indoor/Outdoor stadiums at block /village levels and maintenance of the existing infrastructure needs to be improved. Attention must be paid to construct playground with necessary sports kits to attract hidden talents to think sports as a profession.
- The vision is to develop the facility as an integrated indoor/ outdoor sports precinct of regional standard and to maximize use and sharing of facilities by providing function spaces, meeting and board rooms with central kitchens that can be shared by all users as well as available for public hire. This theme can also be extended to provide central administration area, food and beverage and catering facilities.
- The department needs to focus priority on finance and human resources, to provide back up support especially with respect to coaching and training. Training programme for coaches needs to be conducted at frequent intervals due importance needs to be given to talented sportsperson.

- Awareness needs to be created at all levels through organizing study class, seminar, screening short films related to sports, exhibitions, coaching camps, mass run etc.
- The formation of large number of Sports Club should be encouraged. These will serve urban youth. Regular competitions should be arranged between such clubs within the same city and between the clubs in the various cities.
- National Physical Fitness Programme must be re-oriented and implemented more meaningfully all over the state as a continuous programme. Audio-visual publicity and propagation through mass media would help in not only follow up and feedback but in its further population.
- Sports Festivals should be held at District headquarters once a year and in the State capitals at regular intervals. These will help promote sports consciousness.
- Emphasis should be given to indigenous, traditional and rural sports like kho-kho, kabaddi, wrestling and the like. Yogic exercises should also be propagated and widely practised and included in the school syllabus as part of physical education.
- Associations and sports clubs needs to be given priority to organize sporting events at grass root level and Identification of talents should be on specific sports disciplines with local interest and natural abilities of the sportsperson.
- Introduction of various commercial aspects, such as hospitality packages, branding inside the stadiums etc. for making the infrastructure facilities sustainable.
- Encouragement of different ways to use sport for communication and social mobilization, particularly at the national, regional and local levels, engaging civil society through active participation.
- Working with the voluntary sector (including clubs) to increase its capacity and skills, to develop sustainable solutions for community ownership and operation of sports facilities. Making sport a better business proposition by continuing to drive excellence and equality in sports structures and provision.
- Excellent sports person needs to be honoured with service, scholarship and other facilities and Helping local authorities make positive decisions about their sports provision.
- Encouragement of different ways to use sport for communication and social mobilization, particularly at the national, regional and local levels, engaging civil society through active participation.
- Create iconic facilities for community sport and a new generation of volunteer 'sport makers' inspired by the Games.

- Priorities seeks to prepare the annual calendar well in advance for providing required support to the sports persons for participation in major events.
- Setting up of a State Sports Development Fund for mobilizing resources from other sources other than government.
- The National Sports Festival of Women which should be preceded by State level and District level festivals for women to be arranged by the State Sports Council of Meghalaya and the District Sports Offices respectively, should continue to be held regularly and should include more and more games and sports.
- Disciplines which are more popular and in which the tribal belts have a long-standing tradition like football, track and field events etc. may be assigned to tribal areas. Special programmes for these areas should be planned by the concerned States' Sports Council.
- The various agencies should devote more resources primarily on games and sports at which India has a reasonably good chance of doing well with emphasis on football and athletics. Adequate training must be imparted at the various coaching institutes and camps much in advance of the competitions.

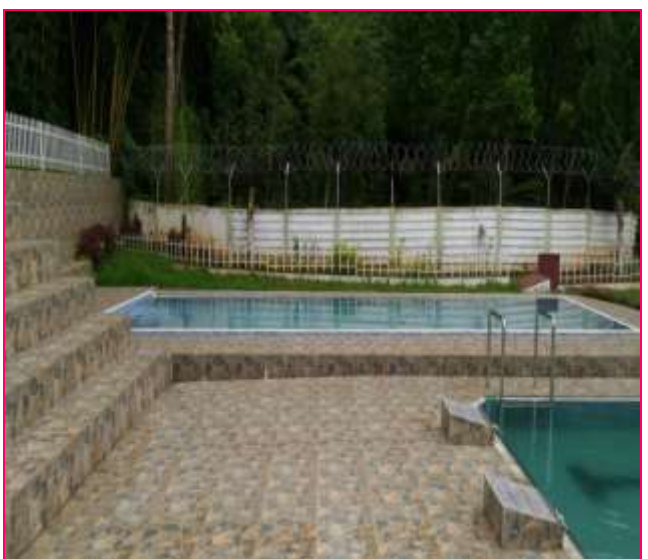

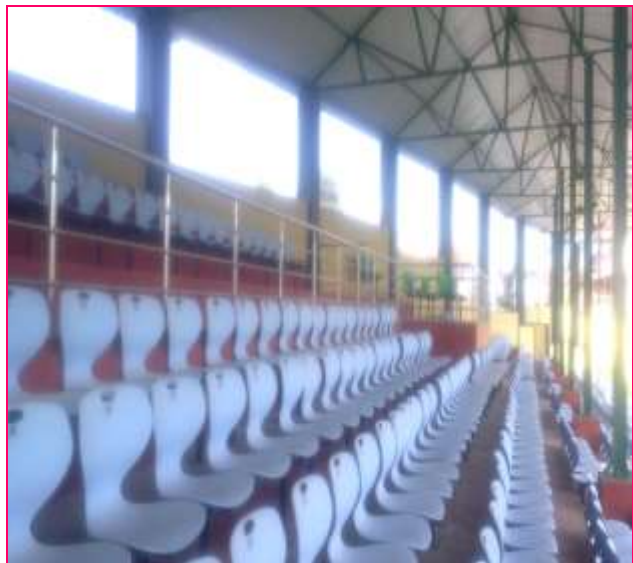
